REAL PROPERTY SERVICES AGREEMENT

- Effective Date and Parties. Effective on December 1, 2010, the COUNTY OF CONTRA COSTA, a political subdivision of the State of California (hereinafter referred to as "County"), and Solano Transportation Authority, a joint powers agency (hereinafter referred to as "Agency"), hereby mutually promise and agree as follows:
- 2. **Purpose.** The Agency is planning the I-80/I-680/ SR-12 Interchange project to be constructed during the Fall of 2012. The Agency has no right of way staff and desires to contract with the County for right-of-way acquisition services.

3. Services by County.

- A. **Administration (RPA)** Duties that cover the general management of right of way activities. These include:
 - i. Developing and monitoring right of way project schedule
 - ii. Obtaining and reviewing title reports
 - iii. Investigating ownerships, easements and title concerns
 - iv. Attending regularly scheduled trend/staff meetings and making presentations at public meetings, if necessary
 - v. Setting up individual acquisition files for each parcel
 - vi. Investigating ownerships, easements and title concerns
 - vii. Coordinating and scheduling informational meetings with corporate owners
- 4. Payment for Services. Agency agrees to reimburse County for all labor costs and appropriate overhead for County Real Property Staff's labor including overtime rates for evening or weekend work (See Appendix "A" for pay rates). Agency shall pay all acquisition settlement and any other costs of acquisition such as title fees, recording fees, etc. Such payments shall be made within 30 days of billing by County. Total payments shall not exceed \$75,000 unless authorized by Agency in writing.

5. Indemnification.

- A. Agency agrees to defend, indemnify, save, and hold harmless County, its officers, agents, and employees against any and all loss, damage, liability, expense, claims or demands of whatever character, direct or consequential, directly or indirectly contributed to or caused by Agency, its officers, agents and employees under this agreement.
- B. County agrees to defend, indemnify, save, and hold harmless Agency, its officers, agents, and employees against any and all loss, damage, liability, expense, claims or demands of whatever character, direct or consequential, directly or indirectly contributed to or caused by County assuming and acting as the right of way agency for and on behalf of Agency.

- 6. **Independent Status.** Nothing herein shall be construed to imply that any County employee providing services hereunder is an Agency employee.
- 7. **Term.** The term of this agreement shall commence on the effective date hereof and shall end upon termination by either party upon 30 days written notice. The rights and obligations of Paragraph 5 "Indemnification" shall survive any such termination.
- 8. **Notices.** Any notice required to be given to County and Agency hereunder will be sufficient if delivered in writing as designated below, or to such other addresses as County and Agency may respectively designate by written notice to the other:

I-80/I-680/State Route (SR) 12 Interchange – Right-of-Way Implementation

Background:

Since 2001, STA staff has been working with project consultants, Caltrans and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to complete improvements to the I-80/I-680/SR 12 Interchange Complex. In order to advance improvements to the Interchange in a timely fashion, separate Environmental Documents have either been prepared or are being prepared for five projects, which include the following:

- North Connector Project (Completed)
- > I-80 HOV Lanes Project (Completed)
- > I-80 Eastbound Cordelia Truck Scales Relocation (Completed)
- ➤ I-80 Express Lanes Project
- ➤ I-80/I-680/SR12 Interchange Project (Subject of this staff report)

Discussion:

The California Transportation Commission (CTC) recently approved using the \$24 M in remaining Proposition 1B Corridor Mobility Improvement Account (CMIA) funds for the first construction package for the I-80/I-680/SR 12 Interchange. STA staff is working with Caltrans to expedite the completion of the Final Environmental Impact Report/Environmental Impact Statement (FEIR/EIS) for the Project.

One of the key phases of implementation for the first construction package of the I-80/I-680/SR 12 Interchange Project will be right-of-way acquisition, which will follow adoption of the environmental document. STA will be taking the lead with the right-of-way acquisition effort. Staff is recommending using the Contra Costa County Real Property Division to provide right-of-way services for STA. The Contra Costa Real Property Division has performed right-of-way services for various outside agencies for highway/road projects for more than 20 years, such as the STA's (North Connector Project), Contra Costa Transportation Authority, Solano County, City of Vacaville and the State Route 4 Bypass Authority. The estimated cost for these services for the first construction package of the I-80/I-680/SR 12 Interchange Project is \$680,000.

Fiscal Impact:

The cost for right-of-way services for the first construction package for the I-80/I-680/SR 12 Interchange Project will be funded with Bridge Toll funds.

Recommendation:

Authorize the Executive Director to enter into an agreement with the Contra Costa Real Property Division to provide right-of-way acquisition services for the first construction package for the I-80/I-680/SR 12 Interchange Project for an amount not-to-exceed \$680,000.
