SUBJECT: AB 662 (Bonilla) – Expanding Access for Individuals with Physical Disabilities - Support

Dear Assemblymember Bonilla:

This bill expands public restroom accommodations to meet the health and safety needs of individuals with physical disabilities. This bill requires newly constructed commercial places of public amusement including auditoriums, convention centers, exhibition halls, sports arenas, and theaters that serve over 1, 000 people on a daily basis to install an adult changing station for people with physical disabilities. This requirement applies to all new construction as of January 1, 2019. AB 662 also requires that renovations of restrooms in commercial places of public amusement to install an adult changing station. This requirement would go into effect on January 1, 2029.

Currently, there is a lack of adequate restroom accommodations for individuals with physical disabilities including cerebral palsy, spina bifida, traumatic brain injury, and multiple sclerosis.
