Project Title:	Contra Costa County Regional Taxi & Online Transportation Services Project
Project Description: a) Provide General Description b) Specify desired deliverables, and c) Describe how final product will be used.	 a) Within Contra Costa County there is a high demand for taxi services and online application based transportation services that are occurring in a largely unregulated industry with inherent risks to public safety. In addition to the largely uncontrolled/unregulated taxi services, there is unprecedented growth in the unregulated online application based transportation companies such as Uber and Lift. While a few cities within CCC have a regulated taxi program, the majority of the County is largely unregulated resulting in unsafe vehicles, unlicensed drivers, lack of appropriate insurance, and drivers with criminal backgrounds. Additionally, there are currently no requirements at the county or city level for application based transportation services. b) This project would create a Regional Taxi and Transportation Program to regulate and reflect the rapidly growing popularity of the application based companies, the needs of the taxi industry, and most important, the safety of our citizens and visitors. c) Our Project goal is to unify transportation services within the county resulting in a one permit process that would serve the entire region with regulated guidelines and enforcement. Annually, or more frequent if warranted, all drivers would pass a criminal background check, driver license check, vehicle inspection, and insurance verification. The number of permitted vehicles and drivers would be based on population studies and community needs.
