WHEREAS, the City of Antioch (CITY) did apply for, and did receive, a NPDES permit which requires the implementation of selected Best Management Practices to minimize or eliminate pollutants from entering storm waters; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the CITY to utilize funds received from its Storm Water Utility Area (SUA) for implementation of the NPDES program and drainage maintenance activities; and

WHEREAS, at the request of the CITY, the Contra Costa County Flood Control & Water Conservation District (DISTRICT) has completed the process for formation of a SUA, including the adoption of the Storm Water Utility Assessment Drainage Ordinance No. 93-47; and

WHEREAS, the SUA and Program Group Costs Payment agreement between CITY and DISTRICT requires the CITY, by May 1st, determine the rate to be assessed to a single Equivalent Runoff Unit (ERU) for the forthcoming fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Antioch does determine that the rate to be assigned to a single ERU for FY 2016/17 shall be set at twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

BE IT FUTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council does hereby request the DISTRICT to adopt SUA levies based on said amount.



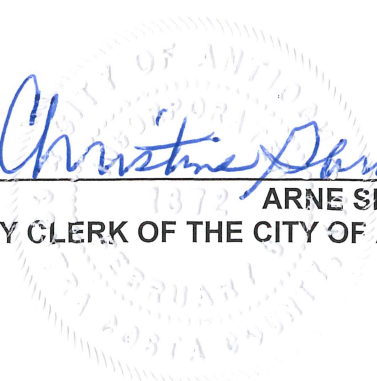

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE RATE PER EQUIVILANT RUN-OFF UNIT (ERU) FOR FY 2016-2017 AND REQUESTING THE CONTRA COSTA FLOOD CONTROL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT TO ADOPT AN ANNUAL PARCEL ASSESSMENT FOR DRAINAGE MAINTENANCE AND THE NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM

**THE CITY COUNCIL
City of Clayton, California**

WHEREAS, under the Federal Water Quality Act [33 U.S.C. Section 1342 (p)], certain municipal stormwater discharges require a permit from the appropriate federal or state authorities pursuant to the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) program; and

WHEREAS, the City of Clayton, in conjunction with other affected jurisdictions within Contra Costa County, applied to the State Regional Water Quality Control Board and received a Joint NPDES Permit which requires the implementation of a Storm Water Management Plan and Best Management Practices to minimize or eliminate pollutants from entering stormwaters; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 2768 (West's Water Code Appendix, Section 63-12 and 63-12.9) authorizes the Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (District) to establish Stormwater Utility Areas (SUA) and to levy annual benefit assessments for the purpose of carrying our activities required under the NPDES program; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City to utilize funds received from its Stormwater Utility Area (SUA) for implementation of the NPDES program and local drainage maintenance activities; and

WHEREAS, at the request of the City, the Contra Costa County Flood Control District and Water Conservation District (District) has completed the process for the formation of a SUA, including the adoption of the Stormwater Utility Assessment Drainage Ordinance No. 93-47; and

WHEREAS, the SUA and Program Group Costs payment agreement between the City and the District requires that the City of Clayton annually, by May 1, determine its rate to be assigned to a single ERU for the forthcoming fiscal year.

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Resolution 9-93, which established the range of the annual assessment to be imposed by the District within the storm water utility area not to exceed \$29 per ERU.

WHEREAS, the City of Clayton has been at its maximum \$29 per ERU rate since FY 1999-2000 (the last seventeen fiscal years) and this same rate is proposed again for FY 2016-2017.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of Clayton, California does hereby determine that its rate to be assigned to a single ERU for FY 2016-2017 shall be set and assessed at \$29.00

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council of Clayton, California, does hereby request the Contra Costa Flood Control and Water Conservation District to adopt the SUA levies based on the above established rate.





WHEREAS, under the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, [33 U.S.C. Section 1342(p)], certain municipal storm water discharges require a permit from the appropriate federal or state authorities pursuant to the National Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Program; and

WHEREAS, the City of Concord, in conjunction with other affected jurisdictions within Contra Costa County, applied to the State Regional Water Quality Control Board and received a Joint NPDES Permit to discharge storm water and developed a Storm Water Management Plan; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 2768 (West's Water Code Appendix, Section 63-12 and 63-12.9) authorizes the Contra Costa Flood Control and Water Conservation District (DISTRICT) to establish storm water utility areas and to impose annual benefit assessments for the purpose of carrying out the activities required under the NPDES Program; and

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT has completed the process for formation of a Concord Storm Water Utility Area (SUA), including the adoption of Storm Water Assessment Drainage Ordinance No. 93-47; and

WHEREAS, the SUA and Program Group Costs Payment Agreement between the City of Concord and DISTRICT requires the City of Concord annually to determine the rate to be assessed per Equivalent Runoff Unit (ERU) for the forthcoming fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Resolution 93-14, which established the range of annual assessment imposed by the DISTRICT within the storm water utility area at an amount not to exceed \$35 per ERU.

RESOLUTION NO. 28-2016

AUTHORIZING THE CONTRA COSTA COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT TO ADOPT THE FISCAL YEAR 2016-17 FEE FOR THE TOWN OF DANVILLE STORMWATER UTILITY AREA

WHEREAS, the Federal Water Pollution Control Act requires dischargers of stormwater to obtain a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit from the San Francisco Regional Water Quality Control Board; and

WHEREAS, Danville, the Contra Costa County cities, the County, and the Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District have joined under the Contra Costa Clean Water Program to secure the required NPDES permit; and

WHEREAS, the San Francisco Regional Water Quality Control Board adopted NPDES Permit No. CAS612008 in order to develop a Municipal Regional Permit that applies to all nine Bay Area Counties; and

WHEREAS, the Town complies with the NPDES permit requirements by operating a local Clean Water Program, participating in the Contra Costa Clean Water Program and implementing Best Management Practices to minimize or eliminate pollutants from stormwater; and

WHEREAS, the funding necessary to implement this permit has been established at a range of \$22 to \$30 per Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU) through the Stormwater Utility Assessment (Town of Danville Resolution No. 24-93); and

WHEREAS, said assessment rate must be set each year by the Town Council; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council appoints the City Engineer, or his/her designee, as its official representative to the Contra Costa Clean Water Program; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council wishes to continue to participate in the Clean Water program and continue to fund the program through the assessment of individual properties; now, therefore, be it



WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City of El Cerrito to utilize funds received from its Stormwater Utility Area (SUA) for implementation of the NPDES program and drainage maintenance activities; and

WHEREAS, at the request of the City of El Cerrito, the Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (DISTRICT) has completed the process for formation of a SUA, including the adoption of the Stormwater Utility Assessment Drainage Ordinance No. 93-47; and

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Stormwater Utility Area (SUA) fee was established in 1993 to finance implementation of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) program and drainage maintenance activities. Each year the City Council establishes the amount of the Stormwater Utility Area fee assessed on properties to finance activities necessary to comply with the federal Clean Water Act and the City's Joint Municipal NPDES permit. Staff recommends continuing to charge the current fee of \$30.00 per Equivalent Runoff Unit (ERU). No increase is proposed.

FISCAL IMPACT

Annual assessments are determined by issuing an "Equivalent Runoff Unit (ERU) multiplier" depending on what "ERU Group" a specific land use falls under. For example, a single family home on a parcel between 5,000 to 20,000 sq. ft. (ERU Group "A") = 1.0 ERU. That results in the homeowner paying \$30.00 annually on their property tax. For most commercial parcels, including supermarkets, restaurants, car dealerships, etc. (ERU Group "J") = 12 ERU/acre. Maintaining the SUA fee at \$30.00 per ERU will allow the City to collect the maximum amount of NPDES funds to run the NPDES program as required. This rate allows the City to meet ongoing costs for fiscal year 2016/2017, estimated to be approximately \$1million. The annual revenue to be generated from this assessment is projected to be \$846,000. Supplemental funds from the City's solid waste fund will be used to help offset expected increases in ongoing program costs caused by the new provisions imposed by the Municipal Regional Permit (MRP).

RECOMMENDATION

City Council adopt the attached resolution re-establishing a SUA fee rate of \$30.00 per ERU for fiscal year 2016/2017, and request the Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water

Conservation District adopt an annual parcel assessment based on that rate to cover City costs associated with its NPDES activities.

BACKGROUND

In 1987, the U.S. Congress began requiring NPDES permits for all non-point source discharges of stormwater runoff entering waters of the state. Permit compliance responsibilities are vested with the State Water Quality Control Board (SWQCB). In 1993, the City of Pittsburg joined with the Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, Contra Costa County, and 18 other cities to create the Contra Costa Clean Water Program to effectively respond to federal and state requirements regulating local discharges of stormwater into the San Joaquin / Sacramento River Delta and other waters of the state.

As a member of the County program, the City is required to fund its pro-rata share of the countywide program costs and the cost of its own City staff to carry out many of the mandates at the local level. In 1993, the City Council adopted Resolution 93-7913, authorizing the County Board of Supervisors to hold a public hearing and adopt Ordinance No. 93-47 to establish the Stormwater Utility Assessment Drainage Fee to help finance administrative and program activities necessary to comply with the NPDES Permit. At that time, \$30.00 was established as the maximum ERU rate for the City of Pittsburg. The City established the initial ERU rate at \$24.00. In 2005, the City Council, by Resolution 05-10273, increased the rate to \$30.00 for fiscal year 2005/2006, because program costs were higher than revenues generated by the \$24.00 assessment. This rate has been re-established each year since 2005.

Under the terms of the county program, each jurisdiction may establish an annual Stormwater Utility Area Fee to be assessed on developed properties to pay its pro-rata program costs and local costs of complying with the federal Clean Water Mandates. The fee is to be based on a single ERU. The Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District requests that each jurisdiction submit its annual fee rate to the District each year for adoption by the County as a parcel assessment.

STAFF ANALYSIS

Maintaining the ERU at the maximum \$30.00 is necessary for the City to continue to comply with the unfunded, federally mandated, NPDES regulations imposed on the City. The existing permit expired on November 30, 2014. However, pursuant to California Code of Regulations Title 23 section 2235.4, and Code of Federal Regulations Title 40 section 122.6(d), NPDES Permit No. CAS612008, specified in Order R2-2009-0074, is continued in effect and enforceable until the Board adopts a new permit for discharges.

NPDES funds pay for staff and material costs for maintenance of the City's existing drainage infrastructure and implementation of mandated NPDES permit requirements.

WHEREAS, The SUA and Program Group Costs Payment agreement between City and DISTRICT requires that the City annually, by May 1st, determine the rate to be assessed to a single Equivalent Runoff Unit (ERU) for the forthcoming fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Oakley does determine that the rate to be assigned to a single ERU for FY 2016/17 shall be set at \$30.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council does hereby request the DISTRICT to adopt SUA levies based on said amount.





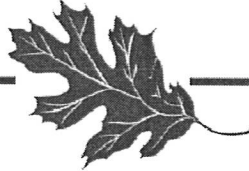
