- I. SCOPE: This policy applies to appointments to any seats on boards, committees or commissions for which the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors is the appointing authority.
- II. POLICY: A person will not be eligible for appointment if he/she is related to a Board of Supervisors' Member in any of the following relationships:
- 1. Mother, father, son, and daughter;
- $2.\ Brother,\, sister,\, grandmother,\, grandfather,\, grandson,\, and\, granddaughter;\\$
- 3. Great-grandfather, great-grandmother, aunt, uncle, nephew, niece, great-grandson, and great-granddaughter;
- 4. First cousin;
- 5. Husband, wife, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, stepson, and stepdaughter;
- 6. Sister-in-law (brother's spouse or spouse's sister), brother-in-law (sister's spouse or spouse's brother), spouse's grandmother, spouse's grandfather, spouse's granddaughter, and spouse's grandson;
- 7. Registered domestic partner, pursuant to California Family Code section 297.
- 8. The relatives, as defined in 5 and 6 above, for a registered domestic partner.
- 9. Any person with whom a Board Member shares a financial interest as defined in the Political Reform Act (Gov't Code §87103, Financial Interest), such as a business partner or business associate.



- II. POLICY: A person will not be eligible for appointment if he/she is related to a Board of Supervisors' Member in any of the following relationships:
- 1. Mother, father, son, and daughter;
- 2. Brother, sister, grandmother, grandfather, grandson, and granddaughter;
- 3. Great-grandfather, great-grandmother, aunt, uncle, nephew, niece, great-grandson, and great-granddaughter;
- 4. First cousin:
- 5. Husband, wife, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, stepson, and stepdaughter;
- 6. Sister-in-law (brother's spouse or spouse's sister), brother-in-law (sister's spouse or spouse's brother), spouse's grandmother, spouse's granddaughter, and spouse's grandson;
- 7. Registered domestic partner, pursuant to California Family Code section 297.
- 8. The relatives, as defined in 5 and 6 above, for a registered domestic partner.
- 9. Any person with whom a Board Member shares a financial interest as defined in the Political Reform Act (Gov't Code §87103, Financial Interest), such as a business partner or business associate.



Dear Board Members,

The County's work on the Contra Costa County Climate Action Plan ("CAP" adopted December 15, 2015) for a more sustainable future is extremely impressive. I look forward to supporting the programmatic efforts described to: 1) reduce Green House Gas ("GHG") emissions; 2) improve public health; and 3) make the County more resilient in the face of future climate change. "The primary objective of this CAP is to identify the County's strategy for addressing climate change locally" (p.10, CAP).

I would like to suggest that this 3-legged CAP stool would be greatly enhanced by adding a  $4^{th}$  leg: 4) **Carbon Sequestration** (particularly in soil).

Before I explain, let me tell you how I came to be involved in working on Carbon Sequestration. I am the Founder and President of *AgLantis*, a 501c-3 non-profit whose four-fold purpose is (See www.Salads4Schools.org):

- 1) Equity (Food Justice, Health, Nutritional Poverty);
- 2) Environment (Protection, Education, Local Food);
- 3) **Education** (STEAM Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Math; Regenerative Ag, including Carbon Sequestratio); and
- 4) Economic (especially Green Job Training and Creation).

This may seem like a disparate menu of purposes, but in reality, these all work together harmoniously within a vision of building a Sustainable and Equitable Agriculture and Food System. And such a sustainable and just system is one key to reducing GHG emissions and carbon sequestration – a major key to achieving Contra Costa County CAP's primary objective quoted above.

The CAP analyses and report suggest that Agriculture (Ag) is an almost irrelevant part of achieving the CAP objectives. Only 4% of GHGs are attributed to Ag, flying in the face of UN estimates up to one third of global warming being caused by Ag (measured as Stand Alone industries are measured in your report with all of the industry's web included, including transportation related to Ag). The CAP report suggests that Ag will add no new GHG emissions in the near future. Hence, the report concludes there is little to be done about Ag. Wow. So, so, so untrue. I would argue that Ag and the Food System is the industry where the County can obtain the most GHG bang for its buck.

What about increases in electricity use due to pumping water due to drought? What about the incredibly destructive effect of tilling on CO2 emissions? Tilling throws CO2 into the air, while we need to be sinking carbon, instead. What about the use of pesticides that destroy the micro-organisms that sink CO2 into the soil? What about the lack of cover crops to protect those micro-organisms so they can do their work reversing global warming? What about the use of compost to feed micro-organisms that sink carbon and enhance soil structure so it holds more water and thus needs less irrigation and pumping of water? What about riparian restoration so our stream beds can sink carbon? What about

swales to hold water and reduce pumping? What about converting to drip irrigation to reduce water use and pumping water? What about agroecology practices that enhance microbial life and sink carbon? What about changing to sustainable or organic practices to reduce nitrous oxide emissions from fertilizer?

As you can see, the 4<sup>th</sup> leg of the stool is perhaps the most dramatic in impact. Contra Costa County is uniquely positioned to be a leader in carbon sequestration. We have broad open spaces and rangelands and farms and generous backyards that could become carbon sinks, with small changes in management.

Let's look at the stunning work of the Marin Carbon Project, which some of you may have seen presented at the 2015 Soil Not Oil Conference in Richmond, CA. (See <a href="http://www.marincarbonproject.org/science/land-management-carbon-sequestration">http://www.marincarbonproject.org/science/land-management-carbon-sequestration</a> and <a href="http://onlinelibrary.wiley.com/doi/10.1890/12-0620.1/abstract">http://onlinelibrary.wiley.com/doi/10.1890/12-0620.1/abstract</a>).

RESULTS: The single application of composted green waste amendments to rangeland not only increased forage production, but *increased soil carbon sequestration an average of 1 ton/hectare (~2.5 acres) every year for 3 years*. Net ecosystem carbon storage increased by 25-70% without including the compost carbon, while having no effect on nitrous oxide or methane emissions. In addition, compost led to increased water-holding capacity in soils.

IMPLICATIONS: Sequestration of one metric ton per hectare on half the rangeland area in CA would offset 42 million metric tons of CO2e, an amount equivalent to the annual GHG emissions from commercial and residential sectors.

As you can see, the 4<sup>th</sup> leg of the stool may be the only way out of the mess we are in – the only path to potentially reverse global warming. Contra Costa County with its bountiful open spaces and rangelands and farms is uniquely positioned to lead the way.

My Resume is attached. It will show you that I am a behavioral scientist. My expertise includes assessment, scientific research – design, data collection and analysis, grant-writing, and I have taught at several major universities. When my career took a new direction as I became involved in fighting science fraud, I gradually became a political activist. I have a major social media footprint and I use this power to educate the public. One of my goals is to educate the public about carbon sequestration, through AgLantis' CoCo San Sustainable Farm. We use Facebook and Twitter and media and hold events to educate the public and local farmers about carbon sequestration teaching the use of agroecology and other sustainable methods of land management. We are also part of a "Growing Roots" training grant with University of California, Berkeley to train farmers in sustainable Ag and will continue to collaborate with universities and public agencies to teach sustainable Ag practices. Lastly, a major component of the 4<sup>th</sup> leg is moving as much of Ag as possible into cities – Urban Agriculture. Growing food locally allows us to use recycled Ag grade water, which is readily available. It cuts the transportation footprint of food farm-to-table, and it allows for greater food justice because produce can be grown in food deserts either on an empty lot or in a hydroponic or aquaponics greenhouse. Local food is more nutritious, as nutrients are lost each day after harvest. I am just highlighting a few benefits of local food. Fostering local food production is critical to resilience in the face of massive predicted food shortages (UN says 1/8 will be starving by 2050).

Contra Costa County is an urban area uniquely positioned for urban farming with an abundance of local recycled water, otherwise wasted, and a perfect Mediterranean climate for growing, deep agricultural roots/knowledge, existing non-profits working on local food production, and an excellent network of local community colleges and universities ready and waiting to participate in training a medium tech workforce for greenhouse growing and also more science-based solutions for agroecology on local farms. We also have one of the 5 largest greenhouse companies in the U.S. in Pittsburg, CA – AgraTech. Adding greenhouses near water reclamation facilities can boost local fresh produce production and create green jobs in urban areas, dramatically cutting the carbon footprint of produce production and distribution. Farmers can add a greenhouse and boost farm net income easily &75,000 per year, perhaps saving some of our local family farms and adding jobs.

Brentwood's Farmer AI of Frog Hollow Farms is a big supporter of our efforts to teach agroecology methods and engage community colleges in training a new sustainable Ag workforce. Several Community College Board members are ready and waiting for us to lead. Diablo Valley College already is training a workforce in the Horticulture Department and has a low tech greenhouse, but could do much more with support and grant funding. Los Medanos Community College's President has expressed interest and I believe the other community colleges and John F. Kennedy University as well, will join us with fascinating courses relevant to this work on reducing climate change and enhancing public health by developing a more sustainable Ag and Food System.





- 7. Registered domestic partner, pursuant to California Family Code section 297.
- 8. The relatives, as defined in 5 and 6 above, for a registered domestic partner.

My experience has taught me that the creation and implementation of a sustainability plan for our future, in a thoughtful and inclusive manner which can be applied practically and transparently, is one of the most critical issues facing our community.

I believe that I am qualified to serve on the Sustainability Commission for the following reasons:

- I have a proven track record on the Board of RecycleSmart, which is a leader and innovator in sustainability in Contra Costa County;
- As the Chair of, and an Executive Board Member of, the Mayors Conference, I have worked cooperatively towards common goals with the Councilmembers and staff of the 19 cities in the Contra Costa. My experience on the Board of RecycleSmart is particularly relevant to the Sustainability Commission. RecycleSmart provides excellent services which are a result of careful planning and outreach. RecycleSmart has made it a priority to reach out to all segments of our community; consumers, businesses, multi-family property owners and occupants, schools and our vendors, to find practical solutions that increase the sustainability of our services in a measured and cost-effective way. We have found that by involving everyone, from the ratepayer to the business owner, from the student to the hauler and recycler, has resulted in the innovative implementation of best practices and helped our agency become a leader in recycling, reuse and garbage services.

Some of the key elements that have worked well for RecycleSmart, and which I think will be applicable to the Sustainability Commission, are:

- Outreach: In order to engage all members of the community, we need to specifically engage with those will be impacted by our services. For example, in the past several years, RecycleSmart has stepped up outreach to multi-family users as well as to the commercial users. We have found that people do want to be involved, they do want to do the right thing and recycle, but they need to be informed and educated. In the same way, we must reach out to all parts of our Community to receive input and provide information about our Climate Action Plan.
- Education: Our program in the schools has been phenomenally successful. The
  RecycleSmart Board Members have recognized that it is the next generation who

  will pay dividends far into the future.

So for example, with the County's Climate Action Plan, it will be key to engage the operators of the landfills and transfer stations, the energy companies, the industries that ring the Northern Waterfront, the building trades, the environmental agencies, and those groups working for the public good. The Sustainability Commission should also be prepared to interact and work with other agencies and departments, such as the Contra Costa Transportation and Transit Authorities, each of which has an important part to play in making our County a more sustainable place to live and work into the future.

There are challenges ahead as we must plan to reach State goals, including a diversion rate of 70%, SB32, as well as other transportation, housing and climate action targets. Working together, we can meet those challenges.

Dear Hiring Committee,

It is with great excitement that I apply to join the Sustainability Commission. While my experience is mostly in education, I am confident that my leadership within the field would be an asset to the commission and to the constituents of Contra Costa County.

In my career as an educator, I have gained valuable experience working closely with diverse individuals from even more diverse areas. I have taught in Longview, Washington, a town abandoned by the logging industry, which resulted in an unemployment rate that hovered nearly 4% above the state average. I have taught in Pleasant Hill, where I encountered a large number of language learners and disabled students, including those with physical impairments, such as deafness, and those with psychological disabilities, like schizophrenia. Currently, I teach a student population in Pittsburg that is predominately first generation African-American and Latino students, most of whom are the first of their family to attend any sort of college. This experience has shaped me not only as an educator, but also as a member of this community. I work to carry my students with me and pay homage to their rich histories and backgrounds, and I can think of no better way to do that than to serve them as residents of the county on the Sustainability Commission.

My work with students aside, I have demonstrated leadership among my peers during my career. While at Lower Columbia College, I was one of the original members of the Sustainability Across the Curriculum think tank, as well as of the campus sustainability club. At Diablo Valley College, I founded the Part-Time Matters Committee to ensure part-time faculty shared a fair and equal voice within the English Department and the larger campus community. Now, at Los Medanos College, I am the Developmental Education Lead for the English Department. In this job, I train faculty on current pedagogies aimed at creating equitable outcomes for our students of color, and I complete program-level assessment as part of the college's accreditation reporting. I also secured a \$10,000 grant to fund a campus food pantry, which will be launching in February of 2017. In total, this experience has not just given me a taste for leadership, but also primed me for a greater role within Contra Costa County.

While I take great pride in my work, I recognize that I might not be a traditional candidate for the Sustainability Commission. Still, if my career demonstrates nothing else, it is that I am passionate about bettering my community. I am energized by the opportunity to further my passion by working with other residents to advise the Board on climate issues that impact our county's future.
