IN THE MATTER OF ADOPTING A POLICY MAKING FAMILY MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS INELIGIBLE FOR APPOINTMENT TO BOARDS, COMMITTEES OR COMMISSIONS FOR WHICH THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IS THE APPOINTING AUTHORITY

WHEREAS the Board of Supervisors wishes to avoid the reality or appearance of improper influence or favoritism; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the following policy is hereby adopted:

- I. SCOPE: This policy applies to appointments to any seats on boards, committees or commissions for which the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors is the appointing authority.
- II. POLICY: A person will not be eligible for appointment if he/she is related to a Board of Supervisors' Member in any of the following relationships:
- 1. Mother, father, son, and daughter;
- 2. Brother, sister, grandmother, grandfather, grandson, and granddaughter;
- 3. Great-grandfather, great-grandmother, aunt, uncle, nephew, niece, great-grandson, and great-granddaughter;
- 4. First cousin;
- 5. Husband, wife, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, stepson, and stepdaughter;
- 6. Sister-in-law (brother's spouse or spouse's sister), brother-in-law (sister's spouse or spouse's brother), spouse's granddaughter, and spouse's grandson;
- 7. Registered domestic partner, pursuant to California Family Code section 297.
- 8. The relatives, as defined in 5 and 6 above, for a registered domestic partner.
- 9. Any person with whom a Board Member shares a financial interest as defined in the Political Reform Act (Gov't Code §87103, Financial Interest), such as a business partner or business associate.

Dear Clerk of the Board of Contra Costa County:

I am writing to express my strong interest in applying for the At-Large, Education or Research Institution seat on the Contra Costa County Sustainability Commission.

I have over fifteen years of professional experience doing clean and renewable energy research, education, policy analysis and program implementation at the local, city, and state level. During this time, I also engaged on interrelated environmental sustainability issues that included soil and water conservation, urban tree planting, solid waste reduction, energy equity, and local air quality mitigation.

My current employer, the Center for Sustainable Energy (CSE), is well-known for leading consumer education and outreach efforts on clean vehicle purchasing as the primary implementer of the California Clean Vehicle Rebate Program with oversight from the California Air Resources Board. The organization's extensive capacity to provide research, education, and outreach lies at the core of my job at CSE to provide our range of stakeholders – customers, technology providers, utilities, and policymakers – useful information that they need to make prudent investments in new distributed energy resources ("DER") that improve the resilience and reliability of the power grid and reduce our energy use impacts on the environment.

Upon attending the Monday, April 23, 2018 meeting, I saw the deliberative conversation take place toward driving one of the key charges of the Sustainability Commission – to ensure that the Contra Costa County Climate Action Plan (2015) is implemented in a manner that is fiscally prudent, efficient, and effectively sustained to achieve the county's ambitious climate and clean energy goals in the years and decades ahead. Relevant organizational advisory and steering experience I have in relation to this Commission include serving on the advisory boards of the Center for Resource Solutions, Green-e® renewable energy credit certification program and the Low Impact Hydropower Institute. Relevant technical experience includes: from 2008-2009, as a policy analyst at the Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC), I advised the City of New York, Mayor Bloomberg Administration on the PlaNYC 2050 first interim assessment report, analyzing the impacts of state energy efficiency and renewable energy policies from 2010 to 2030; and from 2004-2005, co-leading research, analysis and outreach on the State of Michigan's first comprehensive Greenhouse Gas inventory (toward fulfilling my Masters of Science program capstone thesis project).
