whereas, Bill has served as City Manager of Richmond since February 2005 after being recruited by former Contra Costa County Administrator Phil Batchelor, who was serving as interim City Manager at the time; and

whereas, Bill came to Richmond, as he stated it, "because I wanted a challenge. Richmond certainly offered that"; and

whereas, Bill has been credited as a key party in helping to improve the financial condition of the City of Richmond; and

whereas, Bill is credited with assisting the City Council in re-balancing the budget in his first three years of service and anticipates that he will leave the City with a budget surplus; and

Whereas, Mayor Tom Butt stated that "...Lindsay steered the city through the Great Recession, rebuilt the Civic Center and helped attract new businesses"; and

whereas, Bill will be leaving Richmond with the lowest unemployment rate in history, diminishing violent crime, a balanced budget and growing reserves; and

whereas, after years of spending nights at city and community meetings, Bill is looking forward to spending more time with his wife Meg, son Ian, who is in college, and daughter Sarah, who followed her father into public service and is currently working for AmeriCorps.
