Tom Aswad provided Support for Recovery (S4R) updates. Tom addressed the "A Glimpse of Hope" handout in the meeting packet, he said this item will be discussed at the Executive Committee.

Patty Hoyt provided information on Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC), which issued temporary regulatory relief that allows additional access to alcohol during the COVID-19 pandemic. Prevention groups are working with ABC to ensure that these regulations remain temporary.

April Rovero informed the Board that Monday, August 31, 2020 is International Overdose Awareness Day, a global event that aims to raise awareness that overdose death is preventable and to reduce the stigma associated with drug-related death.

#### V. MEDS COALITON

Presentation by April Rovero, Chairperson

April Rovero, Chairperson for the CCC MEDS Coalition, provided an overview of the Coalition's sectors and key affiliations. Their mission is to "Prevent prescription drug (+opioid) related Substance Use Disorder, overdose fatalities, crime and other negative impacts through community education and engagement, policy change and legislative advocacy".

April shared the three main goals outlined in the Coalition's Strategic Plan, which include: increase of Coalition membership, community awareness and expansion of Naloxone distribution.

Antwon Cloird would like to network with the MEDS Coalition to support the homeless population in a specific area of Richmond.

The Alcohol and Other Drugs Advisory Board can help support the MEDS Coalition by appointing a Liaison.

Fatima Matal Sol submitted the staff report in writing as requested by the Executive Committee and made herself available for questions. The format of the report has been changed per the Board's request.

Fatima reported that the grant received by AODS from Health Management Associates (HMA) will be expiring at the end of September. This grant allowed The Coalition meets via Zoom the second Thursday of every month from 9-11AM.

### VI. AOD STAFF REPORT

AOD Staff Report Cont.

AODS to place a Substance Use Disorder Counselor at the West County Detention facility. The Counselor works with the detention facility's medical team to provide clients with Buprenorphine for opioid disorders. As a result, there has been a 58 percent increase of clients receiving treatment at Choosing Change once client is released. Upon exiting the detention facility, the counselor links the client to a pharmacy for their medication to provide continuity of care. Fatima has been in contact with her analyst at HMA to see how the position can be sustained. HMA is going to continue to support AODS until Fatima can find more stable funding.

Fatima added that AODS has been working with the Office of Education and Juvenile Probation to expand Youth Treatment services.

Fatima reminded the Board that September is National Recovery Month. She asked that the Board consider BIBETT Diablo Valley Ranch and their staff for a Recovery Champions nomination for their outstanding efforts during the California fires. She added that the program had to evacuate their clients to a hotel in the middle of the night. Fatima stated the staff did an outstanding job.

Jonathan Ciampi presented the Executive Committee highlights. He encouraged Board members to actively recruit new members for the Board.

Jonathan inquired about the Triennial Sunset Review Survey. The survey is a tool used by the Board of Supervisors to periodically evaluate the purpose, performance, and effectiveness of boards, committees, and commissions. Fatima responded that AODS staff will assist in completing the survey.

Guita Bahramipour presented the Community Awareness Committee highlights. The Committee would like to resume bi-monthly meetings beginning in September.

She reminded the Board September is National Recovery Month. It is time for Board members to submit their nominations for Recovery Champions. \*FUNDING FOR CONTINUING TO HAVE A SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER COUNSELOR IN THE JAIL WILL BE ADDED AS A STANDING ITEM TO THE AOD STAFF REPORT.

Tom Aswad recommended nominating BI-BETT Diablo Valley Ranch and one of their counselors Chris Murray for Recovery Champions. Tom said he is impressed with the non-profit culture of putting their clients first.

Jonathan Ciampi would like the Board to get ahead of the homelessness crisis and think how the Board how they can help those most at risk.

Fatima received a phone call from Supervisor Gioia. The West County Treatment Facility (WestCare) is planning to have their official ribbon cutting on September 9, 2020. All Board members are invited to participate.
