I've been over the health department's website about what is opening and what is not. It works for me but I do have a few suggestions.

1. The pdf that shows what is open on this page shows pools are green/open yet there are conditions on opening (distancing etc). https://www.coronavirus.cchealth.org/health-orders

Should another color be added to indicate when something is fully open with no conditions at all?

I'm asking because I am getting calls to open our pool because the indicator is green. I know there are restrictions in another PDF that also apply but our seniors and the public don't in general. With the new color anyone would know is it fully open with no restrictions or are there restrictions to find and understand. I think this is important for HOAs and small businesses and people that interact with them so they know up front that are restrictions in some way and it's open OR is it unrestricted and fully open.

2. I think a column should be added to the PDF should to indicated if the health department thinks those at high risk should avoid that activity. This would help seniors and others at high risk to know if they should seriously consider if they should participate in an activity or not. As we open we'll still need to indicate to those at risk to seriously consider if they want to attend because of their increased risk.
