Referral History:

On June 25, 2018, the Public Protection Committee (PPC) accepted the "Racial Justice Task Force--Final Report and Recommendations," as prepared by Resource Development Associates and the committee recommended the Board of Supervisors (BOS) adopt the report with the recommendations it included.

On July 24, 2018, the BOS considered adopting the "Racial Justice Task Force--Final Report and Recommendations," as prepared by Resource Development Associates and decided that except for recommendation #18 (related to establishing an independent grievance process for individuals in custody in County adult detention facilities to report concerns related to conditions of confinement based on gender, race, religion, and national origin. This process shall not operate via the Sheriff's Office or require any review by Sheriff's Office staff) and recommendation #19 (related to establishing an independent monitoring body to oversee conditions of confinement in County adult detention facilities based on gender, race, religion, and national origin and report back to the Board of Supervisors.) the BOS would adopt the report its recommendations as otherwise presented. These two excluded recommendations were then referred back to the PPC on a separate referral to gather further input from both the Sheriff and the Racial Justice Task Force on the excluded recommendations. After giving these two final recommendations additional consideration, the Task Force ultimately concluded that due to existing legal limitations, recommendations #18 and #19 should be removed from the final report of the Racial Justice Task Force.

On August 6, 2018, the Public Protection Committee considered implementation of the Task Force Recommendations and provided the following direction:

- Staff should develop a recruitment process to seat the Racial Justice Oversight Body (RJOB) with the following representation:
- 1. A representative from the Superior Court, as a non-voting member
- 2. The Sheriff or his designee
- 3. The Chief Probation Officer or his designee

- 4. The Public Defender or her designee
- 5. The District Attorney or her designee
- 6. A representative from a local law enforcement agency, nominated by the Contra Costa County Police Chiefs' Association
- 7. A representative from the Contra Costa County Board of Education
- 8. A representative from a School District
- 9. A representative from Contra Costa County Health Services
- 10. Nine community-based representatives, that include at a minimum:
 - Two members of the Racial Justice Coalition,
 - Two individuals with prior personal criminal or juvenile justice system involvement,
 - Three representatives from community-based organizations that work with individuals in the justice system, including at least one person who works directly with youth
 - One representative from a faith-based organization
 - One representative that is either a school aged youth or from a CBO who provides services to school aged youth
 - The process to fill the School Board representative is to be determined by current School Board representatives of the Racial Justice Task Force
 - The Racial Justice Coalition will select its two representatives
 - Terms on the RJOB representatives should be for two years
 - Return to the Committee for consideration of the second part of the Task Force recommendation for a RJOB regarding the need for additional resources necessary to staff and facilitate the work of the RJOB.

After the Public Protection Committee met on September 10, 2018, the Racial Justice Task Force school board representatives were consulted and determined that their rotation on the RJOB should begin with Mount Diablo Unified School District, followed by West Contra Costa Unified School District, before ending with Antioch Unified School District. Based on this rotation schedule, Debra Mason was subsequently seated as the first RJOB School District representative on behalf of Mount Diablo Unified School District.

Next, the Racial Justice Coalition subsequently contacted PPC staff and reported that Tamisha Walker and Jeff Landau were recommended by RJC membership to represent this group on the RJOB. The Public Defender, Robin Lipetzky, decided to represent her office, and similarly District Attorney Diana Becton decided to represent her office. The Chief Probation Officer originally designated Director Mike Newton to be his representative, but after the Chief's retirement the newly appoint Chief Probation Officer designated Assistant Chief Probation Officer, Melvin Russell to be her representative. The Superior Court designated the Director of Family Law and Probate, James Paulsen, as its representative. Also, the Sheriff identified Assistant Sheriff, John Lowden as his designated representative, and the Contra Costa County Police Chiefs' Association nominated then Interim Richmond Police Chief Bisa French as its representative.

To identify applicants for the seven remaining seats for community-based representatives, a recruitment process was initiated with the publishing of a press release concerning the vacancies on September 18, 2018. After a 7-week application period the County received a total of 14 timely applications, and one application that was received after the November 2 deadline which was therefore not forwarded to the committee for further consideration.

On November 13, 2018, the PPC interviewed applicants for the seven seats for community-based representatives on the RJOB and recommended BOS appointment of the following individuals:

- Superior Court representative: James Paulsen, Director of Family Law and Probate
- Sheriff or designee: John Lowden, Assistant Sheriff
- Chief Probation Officer or designee: Mike Newton, Probation Director
- Public Defender or designee: Robin Lipetzky, Public Defender
- District Attorney or designee: Diana Becton, District Attorney
- Local Law Enforcement representative: Bisa French, Assistant Chief, Richmond Police Department
- Contra Costa County Office of Education representative: Lynn Mackey, Superintendent Elect
- Local School District representative: Debra Mason, Mount Diablo Unified School District
- Health Services Department representative: Dr. William Walker
- Community representatives:
 - Tamisha Walker
 - Jeff Landau
 - Stephanie Medley
 - Tammy Appling-Cabading
 - Chala Bonner
 - Ledamien Flowers
 - Jay LeVine
 - Cheryl Sudduth
 - Edward Williams

On December 4, 2018, the Board of Supervisors appointed the 18 individuals recommended by the Public Protection Committee to serve on the Racial Justice Oversight Body. These appointments were to be for a two-year term commencing on January 1, 2019 and ending December 31, 2020.

On May 12, 2020, Ledamien Flowers, then filling a Community Representative Seat, notified staff of his resignation from the Racial Justice Oversight Body. Staff reported this resignation to the BOS and on June 16, 2020, the Board of Supervisors accepted the resignation of Ledamien Flowers, declared a vacancy of the RJOB Community Representative Seat 4, and directed the Clerk of the Board to post the vacancy. After a recruitment process was approved by the PPC on June 22, 2020, the ORJ received a total of 18 timely applications, and one that was submitted after the application deadline. This committee decided to consider all 19 applicants before nominating Ronell Ellis to fill the existing vacancy, and Mr. Ellis has been engaged in the meetings and activities of the RJOB since that time.

During this committee's September 2020 meeting it recognized that all the community representatives that were initially appointed to two-year terms starting January 2019 were set to end as of December 31, 2020. This again presented the PPC with the following seven (7) vacancies on the RJOB to fill, effective January 1, 2021:

- 1. Two (2) individuals with prior personal criminal or juvenile justice system involvement,
- 2. Two (2) representatives from community-based organizations that work with justice-involved populations of any age,
- 3. One (1) representative from community-based organization that works with justice-involved

- youth,
- 4. One (1) representative from a faith-based organization, and
- 5. One (1) representative that is either a school aged youth or from a CBO who provides services to school aged youth

During last month's meeting, the PPC approved a three-week recruitment process and encouraged all RJOB members that occupied seats with expiring terms to submit an application if they were interested in renewing their membership on the Body. In preparation of considering their respective renewals, the PPC directed staff to also include a summary of each applicant's RJOB meeting attendance while being a member of the Body. This summary of attendance information has been included as Attachment A and was derived from the approved Records of Actions of the RJOB and its three subcommittees meetings. However, the ORJ also used draft versions of the Record of Actions for the August 2020 RJOB Quarterly Meeting and the September 2020 subcommittee meetings since these bodies have not yet met again, and thus have not had the opportunity to approve these draft Record of Actions.

Attachment B is the roster of ex-officio members who have confirmed their RJOB memberships in 2021-22. Also, please note that the Racial Justice Coalition has not yet informed staff of their RJOB member nominations for the 2021-22 term.

Referral Update:

Consistent with the PPC's direction, the RJOB application period began with the publishing of a press release on September 29 (Attachment C), and subsequently closed on October 19 at 5 p.m. Prior to the end of the application period, five (5) of the seven (7) current RJOB members occupying seats with expiring terms submitted timely renewal applications, and an additional 18 new applications were also received timely by the ORJ. In addition, two (2) more applications were submitted on the last day of the application period after the 5 p.m. deadline.

All 25 applications that were received are included in Attachment D with all signatures and personal contact information redacted. A summary of the information provided by the applicants as part of their respective applications is included as Attachment E, and this summary sheet is organized by last name of the applicants with each incumbent renewal applicant highlighted. All applicants were invited to participate in the optional public interview process for the upcoming RJOB vacancies that is scheduled to occur during the Public Protection Committee meeting on October 26, 2020.

Recommendation(s)/Next Step(s):

CONSIDER interviewing applicants for seven (7) seats on the Racial Justice Oversight Body that will become vacant when their terms expire on December 31, 2020, and that are collectively comprised of:

- 1. Two (2) seats for individuals with prior personal criminal or juvenile justice system involvement.
- 2. Two (2) seats for representatives of community-based organizations that work with justice-involved populations of any age,
- 3. One (1) seat for a representative from a community-based organization that works with justice-involved youth,
- 4. One (1) seat for a representative from a faith-based organization, and
- 5. One (1) seat for an individual that is a school aged youth or for a representative of a

community-based organization that provides services to school aged youth; and,

RECOMMEND candidates for the seats identified above to the Board of Supervisors for appointment consideration.

Contra Costa County Seeks Applicants for Racial Justice Oversight Body Community Representatives Seats

(Martinez, CA) - The Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors is seeking applicants who are interested in serving on its 18-member Racial Justice Oversight Body (RJOB). The Racial Justice Oversight Body will have vacancies for seven (7) Community-based Representatives effective January 1, 2021.

The RJOB is a multi-agency advisory body established by the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors to oversee the implementation of the recommendations made by the Racial Justice Task Force and accepted by the Board of Supervisors to reduce racial disparities in the criminal and juvenile justice systems. The RJOB also reviews local criminal and juvenile justice data in an ongoing fashion to identify and address any racial disparities that may persist.

The Racial Justice Oversight Body is composed of the following 18 members:

- Four (4) Ex-Officio Members:
 - ✓ The Sheriff or his designee;
 - ✓ The Chief Probation Officer or her designee;
 - ✓ The Public Defender or her designee;
 - ✓ The District Attorney or her designee;
- Five (5) Other Appointed Members:
 - ✓ A representative from the Superior Court, as a non-voting member;
 - ✓ A representative from a local law enforcement agency, nominated by the Contra Costa County Police Chiefs' Association;
 - ✓ A representative from the Contra Costa County Office of Education;
 - ✓ A representative from a Local School District;
 - A representative from Contra Costa County Health Services Department;
- Nine (9) community-based representatives selected and appointed by the Board of Supervisors:
 - ✓ Two (2) members of the Contra Costa Racial Justice Coalition;
 - ✓ Two (2) individuals with prior personal criminal or juvenile justice system involvement;

- ✓ Two (2) representatives from community-based organizations that work with justice-involved populations, any age;
- ✓ One (1) representative from a community-based organization that works with justice-involved youth
- ✓ One (1) representative from a faith-based organization;
- ✓ One (1) representative that is either a school age young person, or from a community-based organization who provides services to school age youth.

The Board of Supervisors is seeking applications for the following seven (7) seats on the RJOB:

- 1. Two (2) individuals with prior personal criminal or juvenile justice system involvement;
- 2. Two (2) representatives from community-based organizations that work with justice-involved populations, any age;
- 3. One (1) representative from a community-based organization that works with justice-involved youth
- 4. One (1) representative from a faith-based organization; and
- 5. One (1) representative that is either a school age young person, or from a community-based organization who provides services to school age youth.

Appointments to the Racial Justice Oversight Body will be for a term of two years that will be effective as of January 1, 2021, and ending December 31, 2022. The RJOB meets on a quarterly basis and its members also serve on its three subcommittees that each currently meet on a monthly basis. All members serve on the RJOB and its subcommittees without compensation, stipends, or reimbursement of expenses, and the selection of the community-based representatives are intended to reflect the geographic, ethnic, and racial diversity of Contra Costa County.

Applications will be due by 5 p.m. on October 19, 2020, and all timely applicants will be invited to the public interview process conducted by the Board of Supervisors' Public Protection Committee: Supervisors Candace Andersen, District II, and Federal Glover, District V. This committee will then recommend a selection of applicants for Board of Supervisors to appoint to the Racial Justice Oversight Body.

Below is a complete timeline of this recruitment process to fill the seven (7) vacant RJOB seats:

- October 19: Final Day of the Application Period, due by 5:00 p.m.
- October 26: Public Protection Committee Meeting: Interviews
- November 10: Board of Supervisors Appointments



In the United States, people of color (POC) are disproportionally incarcerated at a higher rate in jails and prisons compared to their white counterparts. This contrast was highlighted when the War on Drugs began and ramped up in the 60's and 70's, followed by the Three Strikes Law in the 90's. These declarations caused the already disproportionate numbers grow exponentially and still today they show no signs of stopping. 2020 has underscored the continuous displays of police brutality and violence inflicted upon Black people; the favorable laws and less harsh sentencing granted to White's; and the families that face irrevocable damage and despair as a result of their loved ones returning from prison without the proper tools and support to get them back on their feet. What these people come back to and face are a society that shuns them, oftentimes excludes them from second chances, and shows discriminatory practices in both housing and employment practices. My business, Partnerships with Purpose, LLC (P2) is a movement to help reduce the rate of recidivism, specifically for POC, by helping to reduce the employment barriers that they face when attempting to be hired back into the workforce. At P2, we focus on building partnerships, not barriers. Having the opportunity to serve would allow me to provide my expertise in matters of racial (in)justice, to continue to use my voice to affect change when it comes to individuals who face systematic oppression, and bring a different point of view to the table.

- 9. Any person with whom a Board Member shares a financial interest as defined in the Political Reform Act (Gov't Code §87103, Financial Interest), such as a business partner or business associate.







Williams bestows lessons

Mentor released, yearns to help peers overcome adversity

A group in their mid-30s forms a circle in LA-103 as they prepare to witness 74-year-old Edward Williams' ability to counsel a room full of teenagers.

In a moment's notice the room transforms from one filled with older people into a space filled with young, care-free, arrogant teenagers from a poor local high school.

Williams' job is to act as the facilitator.

He is a co-facilitator of a progressive discussion about issues that underlie school bullying with the youth who suffer from being bullied, participate in the act or have seen bullying.

As Williams, a health and human services major at Contra Costa College, takes control of the noisy room with his firm voice, he starts explaining what will be discussed and the limits of confidentiality. As the exercise continues, the room becomes rowdy, impatient and intolerant to the things Williams and his co-facilitator say.

As the students in the room began to disengage, Williams maintains his composure and continues. He patiently sits and listens closely to what is being said, by whom, and in what way.

At the end of the exercise Williams tells the students that they should be soft spoken or silent until the person is ready to have a conversation.

"Today's young people from the hood have developed a mental abnormality," Williams said.

He knows troubled youth. Williams said he served 30 years inside the California State Prison in Vacaville where he encountered many young people. Most of them were gang members.

"He is the smartest man I know," Arner Pitts, an ex-Los Angeles crip gang member who was mentored by Williams, said. Pitts said that at first he was proud to be locked up in prison because he felt as though he had "graduated into the big leagues."

Pitts said when Williams asked him his name he replied confidently with his street name, "Spook." Williams frowned, and asked him if he knew his father and with a yes



response from Pitts, Williams requested that Pitts ask his father what the Spook Hunters were.

"I felt like shit," Pitts said.

He found out that his street name was a derogative term coined by the Spook Hunters, a white racist youth gang that directed violence toward the growing Los Angeles black community in the 1940s and 50s

Pitts said, "Teach (Williams) took his time to mentor me and mentored me until the day I paroled."

He said Williams made him read three newspapers a day, study black ancient history up to current history, taught him philosophy and made him into a studious young man. People even started calling him Young Malcolm.

Pitts said Williams changed his mentality from an angry gang member to an educated, sophisticated young man who was ready to be a valuable part of his community.


Pitts said Williams was the source of his evolution as a man.

After parole, Pitts enrolled at Cerritos College in Norwalk, transferred to Cal Poly-Pomona and went on to get his business degree in finance and, eventually, a law degree.

"Teach would always talk with knowledge. He would always be educating someone," Pitts said.

services Aminta Mickles said Williams offers support to anyone, if he can.

"Williams has a spirit of advocacy," intern assistant for Group Processes for Helping Professionals Mariyke Gray said.

During his time away from the college, he participates in the community. He is a member of organizations like the Men and Women of Valor and the Reentry Success Center that help the Richmond community progress.

Williams also speaks to a different group of recently released men every first Thursday of the month in the Veterans Hall in Richmond. Toward the end of his sessions Williams shows the men his mug shot from when he started his sentence.

Williams said, "After serving 30 years, I can see in their faces that they know I know how they feel."

Pamela Saucer-Bilbio, CEO of Men and Women of Valor, said it is a tough field that Williams is going into but there is a need for someone to mentor youth.

Mickles said, "You're only as sick as

your secret, and Mr. Williams told us his. He is tenacious and is already envisioning."

Williams said he is learning from the organizations he participates in and classes he is taking at CCC on how to successfully grow an organization. Williams was influenced by Mace Thomson to enroll in college after being released from prison. Williams returned for his third semester of college after suffering a heart attack last year. He was not able to attend classes in

Mickles said Williams approached her about some of his concerns. One of them was that Williams doubted if he would fit in because of his past. While actively participating in events in the community, Mickles said Williams "fits in."

Notó que, incluso antes de el proyecto de ley de redistribución, SB 109, se convirtió developing a re-entry plan for former prisoners.

"Ithink we all came together and understood that we need to invest money, not just in county departments and law enforcement, but in community-based organizations that are providing real-life services to people re-entering our community," he said. "We need to show that this is indeed successful, so we can be advocates across this state."

Former inmate Clarence Ford, who shared his story at the opening, said the difficulties of re-entering society often became a topic of conversation with other prisoners.

"I was a bit apprehensive about getting released, because I knew that once I was released, I would come to face these barriers," he explained. He said he was rejected from numerous jobs and almost gave up hope until he eventually returned to school. He credits his re-entry coach for helping integrate him back into the community.

"It's individuals like that, working with organizations and agencies, that have the most effect," he said.

Contra Costa County Public Defender Robin Lipetzky added that former inmates need different kinds of help at different times, from job training and support to housing.

"People need those the moment they walk out of a jail or prison," she said. "But [they] might also need those six months or a year into their return. The center is going to be here for everybody, regardless of when they were incarcerated."

Lipetzky said family members of those returning from prison also need support. Brown agreed, noting that families often take on much of the emotional and financial burden when a loved one is imprisoned.

"When you have a family member who's incarcerated, it builds up tension in the family," Brown said. "It makes it hard for a family to succeed. We think of family members or other allies as very important members, both to support the success of people who are incarcerated and also to support their own well-being."

Dameion King, a skills specialist at Rubicon Programs, said he hopes the center becomes more than just a place for information or assistance, but a support network that plays a significant role in the lives of returning residents.

"Some of the piggest challenges that the reentry population faces is having no support systems," King said. "Many times you have men and women who return back to the streets, and mom and dad have passed away, or the close ties that they had to the community are still involved in things that would hinder them.

"It's not a matter of just introducing people to skills and opportunities," he said. "It's finding ways to change people's perspective. I hope that the re-entry center can be successful at giving our re-entry population new lenses -- new ways of looking at law enforcement, new ways of looking at community -- and hopefully they begin to see themselves as stakeholders." •

"Yo estaba un poco aprensivo acerca de ser liberado, porque sabía que una vez que fuera liberado, enfrentaría estas barreras", explicó. Dijo que fue rechazado de numerosos puestos de trabajo y casi perdió la esperanza hasta que finalmente regresó a la escuela. Él acredita su coach de reingreso por ayudarlo a reintegrarse en la comunidad.

"Son individuos así, en colaboración con organizaciones y organismos, que tienen el mayor efecto", dijo.

La defensora pública del Condado de Contra Costa Robin Lipetzky añadió que los ex reclusos necesitan diferentes tipos de ayuda en diferentes momentos, desde la capacitación laboral y apoyo de vivienda.

"La gente necesita eso el momento en que salen de una cárcel o prisión", dijo. "Pero [ellos] también pueden necesitar esos mismos seis meses o un año después de su regreso. El centro va a estar aquí para todos, independientemente de cuando fueron encarcelados".

Lipetzky dijo que los familiares de los que regresan de la cárcel también necesitan apoyo. Brown estuvo de acuerdo, señalando que las familias a menudo asumen gran parte de la carga emocional y financiera cuando un ser querido está encarcelado.

"Cuando se tiene un familiar que está encarcelado, se acumula la tensión en la familia", dijo Brown. "Esto hace que sea difícil que una familia tenga éxito. Pensamos 'en miembros de la familia u otros aliados como miembros muy importantes, tanto para apoyar el éxito de las personas que están encarcelados y también para apoyar su propio bienestar".

Dameion King, especialista de habilidades en Rubicon Programs, dijo que espera que el centro se convierta en algo más que un lugar para obtener información o asistencia, sino una red de apoyo que desempeña un papel importante en las vidas de los residentes que están regresando.

"Algunos de los mayores retos que enfrenta la población de reingreso es no tener sistemas de apoyo", dijo King. "Muchas veces tienes a hombres y mujeres que regresan de nuevo a las calles, y su papá y mamá han fallecido, o los estrechos vínculos que tenían a la comunidad todavía están involucrados en cosas que los dificultarían.

"No es una cuestión de simplemente presentar habilidades y oportunidades a la gente", dijo. "Se trata de encontrar formas de cambiar la perspectiva de la gente. Espero que el centro de reingreso pueda ser exitoso en dar a nuestra población de reingreso nuevos lentes - nuevas formas de ver a los agentes de la ley, nuevas formas de ver a la comunidad - y ojalá puedan comenzar a verse de la ley somo partes interesadas"...

Referral History:

The Public Protection Committee was established by the Board of Supervisors to examine and make recommendations on issues relating to public protection services provided through the County's criminal justice programs. The committee currently has ongoing referals spanning the County's criminal justice system, including juvenile justice, and juvenile/adult criminal administrative fees. During this year's legislative session, a number of bills have been chaptered that impact the Board of Supevisors' recent actions or will impact future actions.

Referral Update:

Numerous public safety bills were signed by Governor Newsom which will affect the County to varying degrees. Below is a list of significant public safety Assembly Bills (AB) and Senate Bills (SB) that have been identified as having an impact on recent actions by the Board of Supevisors and possibily on future actions of the Board.

AB 1185 (County board of supervisors: sheriff oversight.) - This bill authorizes a county to establish a sheriff oversight board to assist the board of supervisors with those duties as they relate to the sheriff, either by action of the board of supervisors or through a vote of county residents; authorizes a county, either by action of the board of supervisors or through a vote of county residents, to establish an office of the inspector general to assist the board of supervisors with these duties as they relate to the sheriff; and authorizes the chair of the oversight board and the inspector general to issue a subpoena or subpoena duces tecum when deemed necessary to investigate a matter within their jurisdiction. This law will take effect January 1, 2021.

AB 1869 (Criminal Fees.) - This bill by the Assembly Committee on Budget repeals the authority to collect various criminal justice administrative fees upon conviction or arrest and also appropriate \$65 million annually for five years to counties to backfill associated revenue losses. The bill expresses the intent of the Legislature to pursue legislation with the Budget Act of 2021 to finalize the funding allocation methodology for distribution to counties.

This bill, effective July 1, 2021, repeals the following administrative fees:

- 1) Government Codes 27712 (public defense fee), 27753 (cost of counsel), 29550(c) (criminal justice administration fee), 29550(f) (administrative screening fee and citation processing fee), 29550.1 (criminal justice administration fee), 29550.2 (county booking fee), 29550.3 (city booking fee), and
- 2) Penal Codes 1203 (interstate compact supervision), 1203.016(g) (adult home detention administrative fee), 1203.018(j)(electronic monitoring administrative fee), 1203.1b (probation department investigation/progress report fee), 1203.1e (parole supervision fee), 1208.2(b) (program administrative fee), 1210.15 (continuous electronic monitoring fee), 3010.8 (parole continuous electronic monitoring fee), 4024.2(e)(work furlough administrative fee), 6266 (work furlough program fee), 987.4 (minor public defense fee), 987.5 (public defense registration fee), and 987.8 (public defense fee).

The administrative fees related to the public defense, probation, criminal justice administration fee, and alternative custody included in the bill were also included in the County's moratorium on certain criminal justice fees. The inclusion of these fees in this bill will need to be taken into consideration when the Board of Supervisors considers the elimination of these fees.

SB 823 (Juvenile justice realignment: Office of Youth and Community Restoration) - This bill creates a new state agency, the Office of Youth and Community Restoration (OYCR), and sets forth provisions for the forthcoming closure of the Divison of Juvenile Justice and transfers the responsibility for the supervision of these youth to the Counties. Among other requirments of this bill, a subcommittee of the Juvenile Justice Cocordinating Council is required to develop a plan that addresses the supervision and programming strategies for this realigned population. This plan will be submitted to the Board of Supervisors with recommendations for the funding allocation that the county will receive, as well as to the OYCR, once the agency is established. Probation will be responsible for the supervision and aftercare needs of this population, including any related contracting needs to support their successful transition back into the community.

SB 1290 (Juveniles: costs.) - This bill vacates certain county-assessed or court-ordered costs imposed before January 1, 2018, against parents and guardians of youth subject to the juvenile delinquency system and against persons aged 18 to 21 subject to the criminal justice system. This bill is an extension of SB 190 (Mitchell, 2017), which limits the authority of local agencies to assess and collect specified fees against families of persons subject to the juvenile delinquency system. Since the County Board of Supervisors had previously taken action in 2017 to eliminate juvenile fees, this bill will not require further action by the County.

Other significant legislation that will impact County departments include:

AB 1950 (Probation: length of terms.) - This bill restricts the period of probation for a misdemeanor, except where specified, to not longer than one year, and for a felony, except as specified, to not longer than two years. This shortened allowable timeframe could potentially impact the Deputy Probation Officer's ability to effectively apply dosage-based evidence based practices. The Probation Department will be closely monitoring this to identify any unintended increase in violations as a result.

AB 3234 (Public Safety.) - This bill authorizes a judge in the superior court to offer misdeameanor diversion to a defendant over the objection of the prosecuting attorney, and continue diverted cases for a period not to exceed 24 months. Per the bill, if the defendant

complies with all terms of diversion, the Judge is required to dismiss the action against the defendant. While in most cases these individuals would not be formally supervised by the Probation Department, this will significantly impact the duties of the court officers. The Judges often rely upon these deputies to make referrals and track program completion for defendants on "court probation." Additionally, this will potentially increase the need for additional programs and services that can be made available for these individuals.

AB 3364 (Judiciary omnibus) - This bill enacts numerous technical changes to several of the California codes as part of the judiciary omnibus bill. One of the technical changes in AB 3364 is the delay of implementation of provisions of SB 10 (Hertzberg), Chap. 244, Stats. 2018, which repeals the cash bail system and instead requires Pretrial Assessment Services to assess a person arrested or detained according to a risk assessment instrument and specifies the procedures for the detention or release of that person until October 1, 2021. The results of Proposition 25, the Replace Cash Bail with Risk Assessments Referendum, will impact this legislation. Staff is continuing to track this legislation.

Additionally, a list of bills impacting the Probation Department has been provided by the Chief Probation Officer in Attachment A. Some of the bills noted in the attachment are included in the list above, but it also includes other bills impacting the department's operations.

SUBJECT: Legislative Impacts

Governor Newsom's demonstrated committment to justice reform was evident by the numerous bills he signed this year which will affect Probation, to varying degrees. The following Assembly Bills (AB) and Senate Bills (SB) have been identified as ones which will impact our operations:

AB 846 requires Peace Officer preemployment psychological evaluations to include an assessment for any bias against race or ethnicity, gender, nationality, religion, disability, or sexual orientation. The contracted provider that administers the psychological portion of our background will be advised of the requirement to include this for all candidates.

AB 1950 restricts the period of probation for a misdemeanor, except where specified, to not longer than one year, and for a felony, except as specified, to not longer than two years. This shortened allowable timeframe could potentially impact the Deputy Probation Officer's ability to effectively apply dosage-based evidence based practices. We will be closely monitoring this to identify any unintended increase in violations as a result.

AB 1979 requires an evaluation of the County's placement resources and programs, as it relates to the needs of nonminor dependent youth, and examine the ability to meet their emergency housing needs. While this will impact the existing work of the placement unit deputies, this bill aligns with the Department's ongoing effort to provide supportive and stable housing for *all* of our clients, as well as our focus on the unique needs of our transition age youth.

AB 2321 and SB 1126 will both impact our records sealing process. AB 2321 authorizes a judge or prosecutor to access specified sealed juvenile records for the limited purpose of assisting a victim or victim's family with processing certain necessary documents. SB 1126 authorizes those records to be unsealed for the purpose of assessing the minor's competency. We will need to amend our records sealing process to allow for potential future access of those records, additionally this will potentially create additional clerical workload to process these requests and "unseal" these records as needed.

AB 2338 permits the court to grant probation or a conditional sentence in lieu of an order for community service, imprisonment, or both for a party found in contempt with a court order pursuant to the Family Code. While these individuals will not be formally supervised by the Probation Department, this will create a potential increase in responsibility for our court deputies.

AB 2606 requires each county probation department to update any supervised release file that is available on CLETS by entering any person that is placed on any form of post-conviction supervision within their jurisdiction. This creates a significant increase in workload for our clerical staff, as they will now be responsible for tracking and updating this information in the CLETS system on anyone supervised within the county, regardless of supervising agency.

AB 2655 establishes a new misdemeanor for any first responder who takes a photo of a deceased person for any purpose other than in their official capacity. The Probation Department is required to notify any staff who serves in the capacity of a first responder of the prohibitions imposed by this bill on January 1, 2021.

AB 3234 authorizes a judge in the superior court to offer misdeameanor diversion to a defendant over the objection of the prosecuting attorney, and continue diverted cases for a period not to exceed 24 months. Per the bill, if the defendant complies with all terms of diversion, the Judge is required to dismiss the action against the defendant. While in most cases these individuals would not be formally supervised by the Probation Department, this will significantly impact the duties of the court officers. The Judges often rely upon these deputies to make referrals and track program completion for defendants on "court probation." Additionally, this will potentially increase the need for additional programs and services that can be made available for these individuals.

SB 203 requires that all youth ages 17 or younger consult with legal counsel prior to a custodial interrogation, and before waiving any specified rights. Existing law currently requires this provision for youth 15 and younger. Juvenile hall staff have already been notified of this change.

SB 823 creates a new state agency, the Office of Youth and Community Restoration (OYCR), and sets forth provisions for the forthcoming closure of the Divison of Juvenile Justice and transfers the responsibility for the supervision of these youth to the Counties. Among other requirments of this bill, a subcommittee of the Juvenile Justice Cocordinating Council is required to develop a plan that addresses the supervision and programming strategies for this realigned population. This plan will be submitted to the Board of Supervisors with recommendations for the funding allocation that the county will receive, as well as to the OYCR, once the agency is established. Probation will be responsible for the supervision and aftercare needs of this population, including any related contracting needs to support their successful transition back into the community.

I am happy to discuss any further impacts, as well how the Department intends to address and respond to the above referenced bills.
