Please carefully consider how your personal experiences, professional experiences, and values will contribute meaningfully to the Council on Homelessness' and the Contra Costa County Homeless Continuum of Care's efforts to make homelessness rare, brief, and non-recurring.

You must submit the County application by 5 pm Friday, September 30, 2022 to be considered.

I am a PhD with a background on data collection, analysis and dissemination. I am also a single, working mom who understands both sides of the story. I am an excellent speaker, professional writer and prior to my homelessness, I spent the last two years distributing food to our community of unhouses in Brentwood and ANtioch. I learned their stories, lack of resources, and backgrounds. And now - Io and behold, here I am myself. Working to change the perspective that the unhoused are lazy or addicts or whatever is imperative. I am more like the majority of the unhoused than not - and I am well educated, employed, non-drug using person. BUT - what I do have the simple definition of being abused and trying to escape it. It's too expensive. Landlords want things that are impossible. Nobody cares when they think you're the problem OR when they are so close to the same outcome, they can't spend their time tying to help.

I've taught classes in intercultural communication - but, I've worked in diverse dynamics forever. The key to working in diverse populations is to listen, ask with curiosity and realize that their way, or understanding is just as valid as ours.

I worked with My Angel's Inc for about two years. It is how I became exposed to the homeless population out here...but, sadly, also part of my own personal arrival in homelessness.

Hold cities accountable for their housing laws. Not one city if far East Contra Costa meets low-income and mid-income housing requirements. If they did...homelessness would be notably reduced.

Educate landlords on the programs/nonprofits that allow tenants to stay in their homes AND the impacts of Eviction on the community, families, and even their pocketbooks.

PD training. So many of the unhoused WORK. Yet, police come to move them and take their stuff...that makes it SO MUCH HARDER for them to work ... making the cycle of homelessness increase. Just because someone is homeless doesn't mean they don't have things. Police can't just take their stuff stating it is stolen. It means that PD need to prove it is stolen and then take it....not just take. It makes getting ahead IMPOSSIBLE>



And although there are addicts and people who just don't want to work, there are also more and more people like me. And the sad thing is, nobody knows what to do, so they just kinda stop talking to you and you become invisible.

I co-founded a non-profit in 2005called From Books to Brilliance and learned the ropes of Robert's Rules, regulations and learning how to work to meet needs, goals and work within political structures in place.
