I am eager to be a bigger part of the solution in our community, in bringing care and compassion to serving this vulnerable community.

When I worked with the Food Bank in Alameda, I worked with pantries, creating new coalitions where none existed. We then did some work on Trauma informed care and what at the time was cultural sensitivity training. Leading organizations and their volunteers to better serve the populations that utilized their services. It is my dream to work on the whole community collaborating on small steps to tangibly provide resources to the community. Increase educational opportunities to work with individuals and families in a comprehensive way, without removing their own abilities to be apart of the solution.

We cannot narrow down people to the one thing we do, this relationship building within agencies When there is an absence of connection of services it tends to compartmentalize people instead of honoring the person and all the parts of their experience.
