



Local Poverty Realities

- Contra Costa median income \$103k (census)
- Contra Costa County poverty rate 13.8% (Public Policy Institute of Ca.)



- 57% Renters
- Average cost of rent \$2411 /income
 \$87,000/\$41.73 an hour (RentCafe)
- Approximately 1 out of every 6 people are hungry (CC Health Services)




