














Monthly Trend of Number of CalFresh Individuals, January 2016 -September 2022






Monthly Trend of Number of Child **Protective** Services Placements, September 2016 -September 2022










Map Feature: Layers






Map Feature: Data by Zip Code






Map Feature: Top Cities by Program






Map Feature: Dynamic Counts

Burgis **Program Glossary** CalFresh, federally known as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), can add to your food budget to put healthy and nutritious food on the table. The program buy most foods such as bread, cereal, fruits, vegetables, meat and fish at many markets and grocery stores. The CalFresh program helps to improve the health and well-being nutritional needs. Cases refer to the number of households receiving CalFresh, which can include a single individual or several family members living together. Individuals refer California Work Opportunity and Responsibility for Kids (CalWORKs), federally known as Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), provides financial aid, employment s them succeed in the workplace and become self-sufficient. Cases refer to the number of families participating in CalWORKs, which can include a single parent and their child or of all people receiving CalWORKs in Contra Costa County. The General Assistance Program is designed to provide temporary relief and support to indigent adults who are not supported by their own means, other public funds, or assistance Contra Costa County. Adult Protective Services (APS) responds to confidential reports from anyone who suspects that an elderly person or an adult with a disability (dependent adult) who lives in hotline is staffed by social workers who respond to these calls and will walk the caller through a series of questions to determine if a situation requires APS intervention.
