Single Plan Model for Medi-Cal Managed Care

Contra Costa County will transition from a Medi-Cal two plan model to a single plan model working with those most vulnerable in the community

#### SINGLE PLAN MODEL

•	Only County that owns and operates a Local Initiative Medi-Cal Health Plan	<ul> <li>Highly regulated, rigid operational environment</li> </ul>
•	CCHP will be the county's primary/single Medi-Cal provider as of January 2024	<ul> <li>Expansion requires broader network and stronger infrastructure</li> <li>Providers including long term care</li> </ul>
•	Expansion of members and services –approx.  240 K and anticipated growth in 2024	<ul> <li>Auxiliary workforce expansion</li> <li>Recruitment &amp; retention</li> </ul>
•	Managed care for all Medi-Cal members  Behavioral Health has always been a single plan model	<ul> <li>Population health management and accountability</li> </ul>
