
Transitioning Existing Buildings to All-Electric Cohort (Fall 2021 – Summer 2022)

Role of County for Building an All-Electric Future



- Don't stand in the way of policies at the regional, State, and Federal Level by,
 - □Organizing land-use policies so that they are aligned with efforts to transition to all-electric.
 - □Streamlining the permitting process
 - □Controlling vegetation in high-fire risk areas

Draft Action Items and Recommendations

State and Regional Collaboration

- Create a framework allowing staff to formally engage with regulatory agencies such as California Public Utilities Commission and California Energy Commission
- Work with regulatory agencies to understand the gas infrastructure
- Track statewide and regional funding

Additional Analysis

Expand on the building inventory and cost analysis

Outreach and Engagement

- Further develop the community engagement strategy so that it centers equity throughout the process
- Coordinate on outreach efforts with the economic development team

Other Actions Needed

- Further explore policy options outlined in the roadmap
- Prioritize the tenant/landlord dilemma
- Seek solutions that make solar panels and battery storage more accessible
- Seek and obtain funding that supports the implementation of roadmap
