WHEREAS, Sabiha Gokcen joined the Contra Costa County Hazardous Materials Commission as a member of the public representing Communities for a Safer Environment in 1993, serving in that position for four years; and

WHEREAS, in 1997, working for the Tosco Oil Refinery, Sabiha Gokcen continued her service on the Contra Costa County Hazardous Materials Commission representing the Contra Costa Taxpayers Association for two more four-year terms; and

WHEREAS, Sabiha Gokcen participated in the activities and deliberations of the Contra Costa County Hazardous Materials Commission with passion, thoughtfulness, and caring for the health and well being of the residents of Contra Costa County; and


WHEREAS, Sabiha Gokcen contributed substantially to the efforts of the Contra Costa County Hazardous Materials Commission, especially in the field of industrial safety, where her expertise and leadership helped craft a series of accident prevention and land use ordinances leading to the eventual adoption of Contra Costa County's landmark Industrial Safety Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Sabiha Gokcen was elected by her peers as Chairperson of the Commission from 2005 until 2008; and


WHEREAS, Sabiha Gokcen led the Contra Costa County Hazardous Materials Commissions during her term as Chairperson in a fair and even-handed manner, creating an open and inclusive forum which encouraged a free exchange of ideas and consensus-based decision making; and

WHEREAS, Sabiha Gokcen left the Contra Costa County Hazardous Materials Commission at the end of her last four-year term after 16 years of dedicated service;

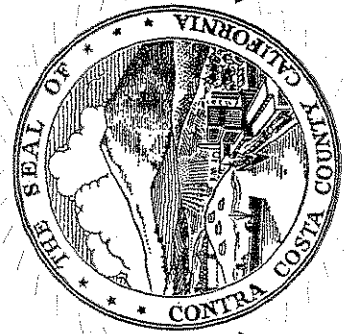
