THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ACTING AS THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY FOR THE CONTRA COSTA COUNTY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY, APPROVING THE ADMINISTRATIVE BUDGET AND RECOGNIZED OBLIGATION PAYMENT SCHEDULE FOR THE PERIOD JULY THROUGH DECEMBER 2013.

WHEREAS, the California state legislature enacted Assembly Bill x1 26 (the "Dissolution Act") to dissolve redevelopment agencies formed under the Community Redevelopment Law (Health and Safety Code Section 33000 et seq.); and

WHEREAS, on January 17, 2012 and pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34173, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Contra Costa (the "Board of Supervisors") declared that the County of Contra Costa, a political subdivision of the State of California (the "County"), would act as successor agency (the "Successor Agency") for the dissolved Redevelopment Agency of the County of Contra Costa (the "Dissolved RDA") effective February 1, 2012; and

WHEREAS, on February 1, 2012, the RDA was dissolved pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34172; and

WHEREAS, the Dissolution Act provides for the appointment of an oversight board (the "Oversight Board") with specific duties to approve certain Successor Agency actions pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34180 and to direct the Successor Agency in certain other actions pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34181; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to AB 1484 ("AB 1484"), enacted June 27, 2012 to amend various provisions of the Dissolution Act, the Successor Agency is now declared to be a separate legal entity from the County of Contra Costa; and

WHEREAS, in compliance with additional requirements of the Dissolution Act, the Board of Supervisors, acting as the Governing Board of the Successor Agency, has considered and desires to approve the following documents, copies of which are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, acting on behalf of the Successor Agency:

- 1. The Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule for the period July 1 through December 31, 2013 ("ROPS 13/14A"); and
- 2. The Administrative Budget of the Successor Agency for the ROPS 13/14A; and

WHEREAS, the ROPS 13/14A and Proposed Administrative Budget will be submitted by the Successor Agency to the Oversight Board for the Oversight Board's approval in accordance with the Dissolution Act; and

WHEREAS, the ROPS 13/14A and Proposed Administrative Budget will also be submitted by the Successor Agency to the Contra Costa County Administrative Officer, the Contra Costa County Auditor Controller, and the State Department of Finance in accordance with Health and Safety Code Section 34179.6; and

WHEREAS, the accompanying staff report provides supporting information upon which the actions set forth in this Resolution are based.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors, acting as the Governing Board of the Successor Agency and in accordance with the Dissolution Act, hereby approves the the ROPS 13/14A and Administrative Budget, in the respective forms on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors (acting on behalf of the Successor Agency).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors, acting as the Governing Board of the Successor Agency,

hereby authorizes and directs the Successor Agency staff, acting on behalf of the Successor Agency, to file, post, mail or otherwise deliver via electronic mail, internet posting, and/or printed copy, all notices and transmittals necessary or convenient in connection with the approval of the the ROPS 13/14A and Administrative Budget, and to take any other actions necessary to ensure the validity of the ROPS 13/14A and the validity of any enforceable obligation listed thereon.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that nothing in this Resolution shall abrogate, waive, impair or in any other manner affect the right or ability of the County, as a political subdivision of the State of California, or the Successor Agency, as a separate legal entity, to initiate and prosecute any litigation with respect to any agreement or other arrangement of the Dissolved RDA, including, without limitation, any litigation contesting the purported invalidity of such agreement or arrangement pursuant to the Dissolution Act.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect at the time and in the manner prescribed in Health and Safety Code Section 34179(h).
