WHEREAS, Contra Costa County is home to many military veterans, and research has shown that soldiers and veterans are at elevated risk for dementia and cognitive decline, due to their increased risk of head injuries, post-traumatic stress disorder and other war-related factors; and

WHEREAS, researchers are making great progress in developing ways to accurately diagnose and treat Alzheimer's disease, and we need to accelerate the pace of that research if we are going to have a disease-altering treatment in the next 10 years; and

WHEREAS, the Alzheimer's Association is marking June as "Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month" and June 21 as "The Longest Day", and asking residents of Contra Costa County to visit actionalz.org to learn more about Alzheimer's and become part of the effort to combat this disease.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of Contra Costa County does hereby proclaim June as "Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month" and June 21, 2015, as "The Longest Day" in Contra Costa County.
