FISCAL IMPACT:

Increased capital expenditures not to exceed \$555,000, offset by 2014-15 end-of-year residual distributions from the redevelopment property tax trust funds.

BACKGROUND:

The Contra Costa County Fire Protection District (District) is charged with fighting wildland fires as part of its primary mission of providing fire protection. The apparatus used for fighting wildland fires is specialized and requires a configuration and specifications not common to the typical municipal fire department pumper. The apparatus used for fighting wildland fires require four wheel drive, a short wheel base, the ability to carry a supply of specialized wildland firefighting equipment, and interior seating capacity for up to four firefighters. BACKGROUND: (CONT'D)

common type of apparatus used throughout the State of California by agencies like the District is referred to as a Type III Engine.

The District currently operates a fleet of ten (10) Type III Engines. Until recently, the District operated a fleet of twelve (12) Type III Engines; however, two (2) of these units were taken out of service for mechanical obsolescence and safety concerns. These two units were manufactured in 1981 and were over 33 years old when taken out of front-line service. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) recommends a maximum of 15 years for front-line service for these types of apparatus.

The California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (Cal Fire) has developed specifications for their Type III Engines that are suitable for the needs of our agency in carrying out the control and suppression of wildland fires. We selected a Cal Fire designed Type III Engine and recommend purchasing two of these units as part of the State of California, Department of General Services (GSA) contract California Multiple Award System (CMAS). This system allows local government agencies to procure goods and services under the State bid and contract award process.

With the current drought conditions and the reduction of the District's wildland firefighting resources, the prompt acquisition of two engines will have a positive impact on District operations and public safety. Because these engines are built by the vendor supplying Cal Fire's apparatus needs, there are units ready to be shipped with no production or build time required. The engines can be delivered and on site within one week of the vendor receiving our purchase order and will be in service and ready to serve the District in a matter of weeks, giving us the necessary tools and equipment to deal with the current fire conditions in our County.

The District recently received a larger than anticipated end of year distribution from the redevelopment property tax trust funds. That revenue adjustment will be used to fund this purchase. The per unit cost of the engines will not exceed \$277,500, including sales tax, and is approximately \$60,000 cheaper than a custom built Type III Engine available through the next lowest available vendor.


CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

Failing to acquire the two engines would result in a continued reduction of the District's Type III Engine fleet and wildland firefighting capacity as California faces the worst drought condition in recorded history and what is anticipated to be a very busy fire season.

RE: Fire Chief's Report

- On May 1, Squad 70 was staffed in the City of San Pablo. Squad 70, like Squad 1 in Walnut Creek and Squad 6 in Concord, is staffed by an Engineer and a Firefighter with one of those being a paramedic. Squad 70 is funded by the City of San Pablo through revenue from a sales tax measure passed in 2014. Modifications to the fire station will need to be made to accommodate the two additional personnel. To date the City has approved \$400,000 towards making those improvements.
- On May 8, Academy 48 graduated and the 10 personnel were assigned to work as an extra firefighter on in-service companies to gain experience in real-life situations. On June 1, they were assigned to fire companies to fill existing vacancies. They are a much-needed addition ahead of vacation season and what may be a very difficult fire season.
- On May 20, the District celebrated National EMS week. This is a time where EMS responders are recognized for their work in saving lives and preventing serious injury. The District held barbeques for the on-duty responders in West, Central, and East County, allowing responders to enjoy the event District-wide. AMR ambulance sponsored the barbeque and fire managers did the cooking. Both fire and ambulance personnel were treated to a barbeque chicken lunch; County EMS personnel also attended.
- The District promoted two fire captains and a battalion chief in the month of May. I want to congratulate Captain Dan Colbath, Captain Brian DaValle and Battalion Chief Jim Huntze. All three of these personnel are highly motivated with skills and experience that make them a great fit for their new jobs.
- The District held its first entry-level firefighter and firefighter-paramedic recruitment in several years. The District received approximately 2,000 applications, however only 780 firefighters took the written test. Interviews will be held in early July and we are planning to begin Academy 49 in early January.

- The District established a recruitment list for filling the newly added Fire Inspector I positions. These positions are in a non-safety Fire Inspector classification and allow the District to expand fire prevention services. There are currently six positions to be filled and interviews are scheduled for mid-June.
- On May 21, after almost a year of work, the District submitted its proposal for the Countywide emergency ambulance transport contract. The proposal is a joint proposal with AMR ambulance. The proposal is very innovative; bringing fire and ambulance service under a single provider. The process is being watched by many fire agencies across the United States as a model for the future. The District's proposal was the only submission. Presentations on the proposal occurred on June 5 and award of the bid should be announced before the end of June.
- The District continues to work with its neighboring fire districts, East Contra Costa Fire and Rodeo-Hercules Fire, to determine if there is any advantage to contracting and/or consolidating with either district in an effort to resolve their financial issues. The District is providing as much aid as possible to both districts while watching closely to assure the service to our District doesn't decline.
- While the temperatures have been cooler and humid, it is important that our residents know this doesn't eliminate the fire danger. The fuels are dry, and fog and light rain do not change that. While the humid air may slow the speed of a fire once it has started, it doesn't eliminate the danger. The upcoming fire season is going to be difficult for fire agencies across the State. Coupled with the fact that many fire agencies in our County continue to be forced to reduce staffing, this could be a devastating year for us. Please be safe!
- The District is in the planning process for the 4th of July holiday and we plan to open and staff our District Operations Center (DOC) like we did last year, as well as staff extra resources directly and with our cooperating agencies to handle the increased fire incidents that occur every 4th of July. Although all forms of fireworks are illegal in Contra Costa County the proliferation of illegal firework use causes dozens of fires throughout our District well into the midnight hours.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Purchasing Agent, on behalf of the Fire Chief, to execute a purchase order with LN Curtis & Sons in an amount not to exceed \$155,000 for five (5) sets of Hurst eDraulic extrication tools for rescue and emergency medical response.

FISCAL IMPACT:

No impact to 2014-15 budget. Funds for this purchase will be reallocated from a non-capital expenditure account to a capital expenditure account, but there will be no net increase to the District's 2014-15 budgeted expenditure appropriations.

BACKGROUND:

The Contra Costa County Fire Protection District (District) is charged with providing rescue and emergency medical services as one of its primary missions. A common type of rescue involves use of the "Jaws of Life" tool to perform extrications of patients from badly damaged vehicles. The equipment used for these extrications is specialized hydraulically operated rams, spreaders, and cutters capable of manipulating metal and structural elements of vehicles so that first responders can get to patients who are trapped and injured.

BACKGROUND: (CONT'D)

The District's current inventory of Hurst extrication tools is old and in need of replacement. The District did not have the funds to replace aging equipment over the last several years and the need for new replacement equipment has been building over the course of the recent recession. In addition, the new apparatus recently ordered by the District were specified to carry modern extrication equipment and older, larger, heavier equipment will not fit in the newly designed apparatus. The District needs to purchase new equipment to provide reliable extrication tools for the personnel assigned to our truck and rescue companies who perform extrication of patients from vehicles.

The new equipment is more efficient than our current toolsets as they are self-contained and do not need a remote power source to provide hydraulic pressure. The new tools can be deployed more quickly and effectively to save lives. The Hurst eDraulic ram, cutter, and spreader were selected to provide the essential functions of vehicle extrication for our District.

The five sets of tools (one ram, one cutter, and one spreader per set) would be placed on each front-line truck company in the District just as our current extrication equipment is already located. Truck companies are dispatched to vehicle accidents or other rescues where patient entrapment is suspected or confirmed.

CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

Failing to acquire the five sets of extrication equipment would result in new apparatus not being able to carry certain tools necessary to perform vehicle extrication. In addition, existing older equipment would continue to serve in front-line service with less reliability and efficiency.

In an effort to ensure agencies are fully reimbursed in a timely manner, the State has asked each participating agency to adopt a resolution that lists all response personnel who may be deployed on a mutual aid assignment and may be eligible for pass-through pay with or without MOU language.

Authorizing portal to portal pay for employees ensures that the District will continue to be eligible for full reimbursement through the CFAA.

- 5. Fire District response personnel include: Battalion Chief, Fire Captain, Fire Captain-Paramedic, Fire Prevention Captain, Engineer, Engineer-Paramedic, Firefighter, Firefighter-Paramedic, Telecommunications Specialist, Fire Investigator, Fire Inspector, Senior Dispatcher, Dispatcher, and Fire Equipment Mechanic.
