FISCAL IMPACT:

BACKGROUND:

In the early morning hours of September 17, 2015, the crew from Contra Costa County Fire Protection District's Fire Station 8 and American Medical Response (AMR) responded to the In-Shape health club in Concord.

A 57-year-old male collapsed while playing a game of basketball at the health club. At the direction of the District's emergency medical dispatcher, In-Shape staff started cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and put the patient on an automated external defibrillator (AED). One shock was delivered right as the AMR and Engine 8 crews were arriving to the scene.

With great teamwork, our crews took over CPR, delivered a second shock on their Life-Pak 15 Monitor, and converted the patient into a normal sinus rhythm with good vital signs. A 12-lead electrocardiogram (ECG) test was then performed indicating the patient

was having a heart attack.

The patient was taken to the emergency room at John Muir Medical Center in Concord and then immediately to the cardiac catheterization lab where they removed a clot in the patient's coronary artery and put a stent in.

The patient was discharged and has now returned to his family, work, and regular life activities with no permanent heart damage.

This presentation recognizes the quick-thinking and outstanding work of In-Shape staff (Manager Karen Puerpho and Aaron Swift), the Engine 8 crew (Captain Vito Impastato, Engineer Manny Harris, and Firefighter-Paramedic Dylan Fuchs), Senior Fire Dispatcher Margee Freudenthal, and AMR crew members (Todd Goforth and Sean Lindsey).

This successful response illustrates the effectiveness of the chain of survival from bystanders to emergency medical providers and, ultimately, cardiac specialty care hospitals.

RE: Fire Chief's Report

- The District continues to work on the rebuilding of Fire Station 16 in Lafayette. The District's contractor, facilities manager, and a structural engineer have been working to determine if there are any issues that would prevent us from utilizing the existing frame and foundation to rebuild the station. To date nothing has been found that would contradict the tentative plan. The original drawings have not been located, so our next step is to contract with a firm to produce drawings for the fire station. Once we have drawings in our possession, we can proceed with requesting bids for the construction phase.
- The District continues to work with County Counsel and the County Administrator's
 Office to finalize our contract with the County Emergency Medical Services Agency.
 This has been a tedious process, but we are very near completion. Once completed,
 the District will begin work with County Counsel on the contract between the District
 and AMR.
- The District continues to work on filling vacant positions. We are moving forward with Academy 49, which is slated to begin in early January 2016. We have interviewed candidates to fill a vacant dispatcher position and will begin interviews for fire equipment mechanics and fleet manager this month.
- Our new apparatus are nearing completion and final inspections should be done by the end of November. Deliveries will begin after the first of the year and continue throughout the first quarter of 2016.
- In July, we received approval to add a third firefighter to Squad 6 (Concord) and make it a full engine company due to a very high hazard fire season. On November 3rd we reduced staffing back to two firefighters, placing Squad 6 back in service now that the fire season appears to be over. During July, August, and September, Engine 6 ran 1,035 incidents, averaging 11 calls per day. Of those 1,035 incidents, 160 were fires and 385 were non-medical calls. Although Engine 6 is down-staffed again for the winter, it is one of our top priorities to re-staff next budget year.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Fire Chief, or his designee, to execute a purchase order with LDV, Inc. for the manufacture and sale of one (1) Mobile Command Unit in amount not to exceed \$976,500.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The proposed order of one (1) mobile command unit is valued at \$976,500 including sales tax and all associated charges. This purchase is primarily funded through a grant from the Department of Homeland Security Fiscal Year (FY) 2014 Assistance to Firefighters Grant program. The grant award is in the amount of \$849,131.00. As a condition of the grant, the District is required to contribute a cost match in the amount of \$127,369.00 of non-Federal funds, or 15 percent of the Federal contribution of \$849,131.00, for a total sum of \$976,500.

BACKGROUND:

In December 2014 the Contra Costa County Fire Protection District (District) Board of Directors authorized the Fire Chief to apply for and accept grant funding for a regional command unit through the U.S. Department of Homeland Security Federal Emergency Management Agency Assistance to Firefighters Grant program. The grant funds a mobile command unit to support the implementation

of the incident command system effectively at large scale incidents in the District and throughout the County. The grant application was supported by all the fire agencies throughout the County and is intended to improve collaboration among the fire agencies at large incidents.

The District was awarded the grant for the mobile command unit. The vehicle will provide a platform to serve the needs of incident command team personnel in providing effective command, control, and planning at these incidents. There is currently no fire-based mobile command unit within the County. The unit will complement the other regional assets in the County, including the San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District mobile communications unit, as well as the recently acquired Sheriff's Office mobile command unit.

The mobile command unit will be able to support up to 11 personnel functioning inside to fill the positions necessary to provide overhead support and command, communication, and control at large scale fires or other long term emergency incidents. The unit will function as the primary support vehicle for East Bay Incident Management Team (EBIMT) deployments within the County and could be made available for that team's use in Alameda County, the partner county of the EBIMT.

The unit will be manufactured by LDV, Inc., which is the same manufacturer of the Sheriff's Office mobile command unit. Efforts are focused on providing a platform that complements the Sheriff's unit so that both vehicles could be deployed together at large scale disasters, and the units can be used in support of either agency in the case of mechanical breakdowns or other out-of-service issues. Acquisition from the same vendor also ensures compatibility of systems and commonality for County and District radio technicians and information technology personnel to perform maintenance and repair on the unit.

The unit will be purchased under a cooperative purchasing agreement using either the Federal General Services Administration (GSA) schedule or the Houston-Galveston Area Council (HGAC) purchasing contract.

The manufacturing process is approximately eight (8) months and it is anticipated the unit will be delivered to the District in August 2016.

CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

The District will not be able to take advantage of the \$849,131 in Federal funding and the District and the County will not have a fire-based mobile command unit.
