Enforcement Roles

Contra Costa Environmental Health

- **Implement & Enforce Proposed Hauler Ordinance**, Chapter 418-2 (Unincorporated)
- **Enforce Title 14 Requirements in CA Code of Regulations**
(Countywide except City of Pittsburg)

Department of Conservation & Development

- **Administer County's four Franchise Agreements/Amendments**
(Portion of Unincorporated - about 53% of the Population)
- **Enforce Debris Recovery Requirements in CalGreen** (Unincorporated)

Sheriff's Office

- **Criminal enforcement authority for misdemeanor theft** (Unincorporated)

District Attorney's Office

- **Prosecute violations of Chapter 418-7 requiring Collection Franchise Agreements**
(Unincorporated)

Revised Chapter 418-2 Ordinance

Issues Addressed in the Ordinance

Performance Bond required

Exempts: Self-haul, Building Contractors, Landscapers & Industrial

Vehicles used to haul Debris Boxes must display County issued decal

Permit not issued if proposed hauling would violate a Franchise Agreement

Additional Ordinance Considerations

Enforceability

Five Other Local Agencies with Overlapping Ordinance Authority:

Issues Addressed by State Laws & Regs

CCR Title 14 Requires

- Vehicles: *Operator Name*
- Boxes: *Name & Phone*

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Next Steps

Potential Board Recommendations

Adopt revised Chapter 418-2 and have it take effect upon approval of:

- a. Performance Bond amount (via Fee resolution), and
- b. Minor County Franchise amendments (below).

Provide haulers with staff proposed amendment to County Franchises (clarification for Industrial Waste and Exceptions section).

Direct staff to proceed with 5-Year Rule noticing to maximize County's future decision-making flexibility.

Ask Franchise haulers to seek franchise cities' PDs willingness to enforce PRC Sections 41950, 41951 & 41955 pertaining to the theft of recyclable

Future Steps for Consideration

Franchise Exclusivity Options

5-Year Rule notices are issued, direct staff to gather and analyze information options pertaining to expanding franchise exclusivity.

Decide whether to negotiate terms of Franchise amendments that would grant expanded franchise exclusivity.

Extending Enforcement Countywide

Encourage cities to adopt their own Hauler Ordinances modeled from Chapter 18-2.
