## Federal Legislation History

- Authorized in the December 2020 stimulus package (H.R. 133)
  - \$75,822,311 for Contra Costa
  - County received direct allocation of \$34,296,331 on January
    20<sup>th</sup>
  - State allocation has reserved an additional \$41,525,980 for Contra Costa
- County Administrator convened an interdepartmental workgroup to provide policy analysis to the Board



## State Legislation History

- SB 91 signed by the Governor on January 29, 2021
  - Includes eviction protections through June 30, 2021
  - Develops a statewide Rental Assistance Program using Federal stimulus dollars as funding source
- Provides additional eligibility criteria over and above the Federal criteria
- Provides three specific options for counties and large cities to select to implement the State program



## State Option A

**Option A**: Participate in the State's Conforming Program and direct County's federal allocation through the State Program

**Summary**: County provides the State with the County's Federal direct ERAP allocation and the State runs the State Conforming ERAP program

**Financial Impact**: Directs \$75,307,866 to the State for benefit of Contra Costa residents; County retains \$514,445 for local community engagement and program outreach

### **Pros:**

- 1. Pools County allocation with State allocation
- 2. Single point of contact for impacted residents across the State
- 3. County keeps 1.5% of its Federal allocation, approximately \$514,445, for local community engagement and program outreach

### Cons:

- 1. Less ability to assist with case-by-case issues/solve problems
- 2. No ability for County to ensure performance of State or its contractors
- 3. No opportunity for local policy input on eligibility criteria



## State Program Rollout

- State Program went live Monday, March 15<sup>th</sup> as planned

### Recommendation for Local Funding

- \$514,445 Available for Allocation (1.5% of Federal Allocation)
- February 9, 2021 Direction to Staff
  - Work with Raise the Roof Coalition to determine allocation proposal
  - Review Census 2020 program model
- Summary of Joint Proposal with Raise the Roof Coalition
  - \$313,320 Community Outreach & Engagement
    - \$75,000 Local Housing Stability Services
    - \$50,000 211 for Rental Assistance Navigation
    - \$20,000 Emergent Needs
    - \$55,680 Fiscal/Administrative Fee Allowance

\$514,000 Total



### Recommendation for Local Funding

- RCF Connects self-identified by Raise the Roof Coalition to serve as Lead Agency \$55,680
- Community Outreach and Engagement \$313,320
  - Convene ERAP Oversight Team (Government and CBO representatives)
  - Issue RFP to selected trusted CBOs and Faith communities for targeted outreach, similar to Census 2020, awarding micro-grants of \$2k-\$30k in size
  - Convene regular Countywide and Sub-regional Coordinating Council of grantees, state funded local agencies and other stake holders

#### Local Housing Stability Services - \$75,000

- Issue RFP for CBO to provide support to residents regarding tenants rights, access to various housing services including ERAP, provide consults related to the eviction moratorium on related issues
- Builds upon existing infrastructure funded by CDBG
- Complements services provided by 211

### 211 for Rental Assistance Navigation - \$50,000 (Contract via the County)

- For rental assistance navigation and build out referral service to existing networks of providers
- 24/7 access for Contra Costa residents seeking assistance and referrals
- Contra Costa 211 working with regional 211s on rental assistance already; this allocation lifts up that effort

#### Emergent Needs Reserve - \$20,000

- Designed to have reserve funds in hand to address targeted issues that come up during the ERAP performance period
- Could include outreach to hard to reach populations



### Considerations

- County staff supportive of joint proposal
- Uses principles of Census 2020
  - Advances 50% of funds to contractors initially
  - Remainder advanced after receipt of progress reporting
  - Community Outreach allocation focusing on micro-granting strategy
- Raise the Roof has self-identified RCF Connects as Lead Agency to operate program and administer contracts (with exception of 211)
  - The Board may wish to direct staff to conduct an RFP to determine the lead agency
