Cal OES Form 130 Instructions

A Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution for Non-State Agencies is required of all Applicants to be eligible to receive funding. A new resolution must be submitted if a previously submitted resolution is older than three (3) years from the last date of approval, is invalid, or has not been submitted.

When completing the Cal OES Form 130, Applicants should fill in the blanks on pages 1 and 2. The blanks are to be filled in as follows:

Resolution Section:

OES-FPD-130 (Rev. 10-2022)

Governing Body: This is the group responsible for appointing and approving the Authorized Agents.

Examples include: Board of Directors, City Council, Board of Supervisors, Board of Education, etc.

Name of Applicant: The public entity established under the laws of the State of California.

Examples include: School District, Office of Education, City, County or Non-profit agency that has applied for the grant, such as: City of San Diego, Sacramento County, Burbank Unified School District, Napa County Office of Education, University Southern California.

Authorized Agent: These are the individuals that are authorized by the Governing Body to engage with the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services regarding grants for which they have applied. There are two ways of completing this section:

- 1. Titles Only: The titles of the Authorized Agents should be entered here, not their names. This allows the document to remain valid if an Authorized Agent leaves the position and is replaced by another individual. If "Titles Only" is the chosen method, this document must be accompanied by either a cover letter naming the Authorized Agents by name and title, or the Cal OES AA Names document. The supporting document can be completed by any authorized person within the Agency (e.g., administrative assistant, the Authorized Agent, secretary to the Director). It does not require the Governing Body's signature.
- Names and Titles: If the Governing Body so chooses, the names and titles of the Authorized Agents would be listed. A new Cal OES Form 130 will be required if any of the Authorized Agents are replaced, leave the position listed on the document, or their title changes.

Checking Universal or Disaster-Specific Box: A Universal resolution is effective for all past disasters and for those declared up to three (3) years following the date of approval. Upon expiration it is no longer effective for new disasters, but it remains in effect for disasters declared prior to expiration. It remains effective until the disaster goes through closeout unless it is superseded by a newer resolution.

Governing Body Representative: These are the names and titles of the approving Board Members.

Examples include: Chairman of the Board, Director, Superintendent, etc. The names and titles **cannot** be one of the designated Authorized Agents. A minimum of three (3) approving board members must be listed. If less than three are present, meeting minutes must be attached in order to verify a quorum was met.

Certification Section:

Name and Title: This is the individual in attendance who recorded the creation and approval of this resolution.

Examples include: City Clerk, Secretary to the Board of Directors, County Clerk, etc. This person **cannot** be one of the designated Authorized Agents or Approving Board Member. If a person holds two positions (such as City Manager and Secretary to the Board) and the City Manager is to be listed as an Authorized Agent, then that person could sign the document as Secretary to the Board (not City Manager) to eliminate "Self-Certification."

RESOLUTION NO. 2023/01 (BLACKHAWK GHAD)

SUBJECT: Adopting Resolution No. 2023/01 authorizing the GHAD General Manager and GHAD Legal Counsel to work with the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) for purposes of obtaining federal financial assistance for the performance of disaster services.

WHEREAS, on April 22, 1986, the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution 86/210 approving the formation of the Blackhawk Geologic Hazard Abatement District ("GHAD") and appointed itself to serve as the GHAD Board of Directors.

WHEREAS, on June 7, 2022, the GHAD Board of Directors adopted the budget for the fiscal year 2022/2023 prepared by the GHAD General Manager, Sands Construction Company, Inc. pursuant to Resolution No. 2022/02; this budget did not fully contemplate the cost of services that would be associated with damages caused by the 2022/2023 winter storms.

WHEREAS, in the winter of 2022/2023 severe storms occurred through California and greatly impacted the GHAD resulting in geologic hazards that threaten public health and safety; President Joseph R. Biden, Jr and Governor Gavin Newson declared emergencies in response to these storms.

WHEREAS, as required by the GHAD's Plan of Control, the GHAD Manager performed emergency services required by the storms and these services will continue to be performed until the damage is mitigated, resolved and/or addressed.

WHEREAS, the GHAD's existing budget does not contemplate the severity of the damage for unforeseen disasters and the use of the funds in the fiscal year 2022/2023 budget will jeopardize the extent of services that can be performed by the GHAD.

WHEREAS, as a public entity under the GHAD Laws (Pub Res Code Sect 26500 et seq.), the GHAD desires to seek federal financial assistance through Cal OES for the performance of services as a result of disasters that has and will occur and presently. the winter 2022/2023 storms.

WHEREAS, in order to seek federal assistance, the GHAD Board is required to authorize certain GHAD Officers to work with Cal OES to seek assistance; attached to Resolution No, 2023/01 as Exhibit A is the Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution for Non-State Agencies (Designation Resolution) authorizing the GHAD General Manager and the GHAD Legal Counsel to seek federal assistance.

WHEREAS, the GHAD General Manager and GHAD Attorney recommend the GHAD Board adopt GHAD Resolution No. 2023/01 authorizing the GHAD Clerk to execute the Designation Resolution on behalf of the GHAD Board so that federal assistance can be sought for disasters that have and will occur.

The Board of Directors of the GHAD HEREBY RESOLVES THAT:

- 1. The GHAD Board hereby adopts Resolution No. 2023/01 authorizing the GHAD General Manager and GHAD Legal Counsel to work with the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) for purposes of obtaining federal financial assistance for the performance of disaster services that pose a threat to the public health and safety.
- 2. The GHAD Board directs the GHAD Clerk to immediately execute the Designation Resolution on behalf of the GHAD Board and file it with Cal OES in order to seek financial assistance.
 - 3. The recitals are incorporated herein by this reference.

This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.

WHEREAS, as a public entity under the GHAD Laws (Pub Res Code Sect 26500 et seq.), the GHAD desires to seek federal financial assistance through Cal OES for the performance of services as a result of disasters that has and will occur and presently. the winter 2022/2023 storms.

WHEREAS, in order to seek federal assistance, the GHAD Board is required to authorize certain GHAD Officers to work with Cal OES to seek assistance; attached to Resolution No, 2023/01 as Exhibit A is the Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution for Non-State Agencies (Designation Resolution) authorizing the GHAD General Manager and the GHAD Legal Counsel to seek federal assistance.

WHEREAS, the GHAD General Manager and GHAD Attorney recommend the GHAD Board adopt GHAD Resolution No. 2023/01 authorizing the GHAD Clerk to execute the Designation Resolution on behalf of the GHAD Board so that federal assistance can be sought for disasters that have and will occur.

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- 1. The GHAD Board hereby adopts Resolution No. 2023/01 authorizing the GHAD General Manager and GHAD Legal Counsel to work with the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) for purposes of obtaining federal financial assistance for the performance of disaster services that pose a threat to the public health and safety.
- 2. The GHAD Board directs the GHAD Clerk to immediately execute the Designation Resolution on behalf of the GHAD Board and file it with Cal OES in order to seek financial assistance.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The GHAD is funded 100% through an ad valorem property tax shares with CSA M-23 and collected on properties within the GHAD.

BACKGROUND:

On April 22, 1986, the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution 86/210 approving the formation of the GHAD and appointed itself to serve as the GHAD Board of Directors.

As a public entity under the GHAD Laws (Pub Res Code Sect 26500 et seq.), the GHAD desires to seek federal financial assistance through Cal OES for the performance of services as a result of disasters that has and will occur. Presently, the GHAD is performing such services as a result of the 2022/2023 winter storms. The GHAD is responsible and required to perform emergency and disaster services (in addition to other services) as required under the GHAD's Plan of Control. The GHAD has been working diligently to respond to the 2022/2023 winter storm disaster by addressing damages from geologic hazards caused by the storms including landslide and mud flows that pose a threat to public health and safety.

In order to seek federal assistance, the GHAD Board is required to authorize certain GHAD Officers to work with Cal OES to seek assistance. Attached to Resolution No, 2023/01 as Exhibit A is the Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution for Non-State Agencies (Designation Resolution) authorizing the GHAD General Manager and the GHAD Legal Counsel to seek federal assistance. GHAD Resolution No, 2023/01 authorizes the GHAD Clerk to execute the Designation Resolution on behalf of the GHAD Board.
