Approval of this Interagency Agreement will result in a total payment to the County not to exceed \$8,000. No County match required.


BACKGROUND:

In the past, Mt. Diablo Unified School District employees received vouchers to be used at Public Health Clinics for TB testing. Employees experienced extremely long waits to redeem their vouchers for testing and subsequent reading. In an effort to provide better services, Mt. Diablo Unified School District, Contra Costa Health Services, Public Health Clinic Services have coordinated to provide TB testing and readings services at two MDUSD facilities.
