Approve and authorize the Health Services Director, or his designee, to execute, on behalf of the County, Contract #74-417-2 with Gary S. Nye, M.D., a self-employed individual, in an amount not to exceed \$174,720 to provide professional outpatient psychiatric services, for the period from January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013.
