This Contract includes a six-month automatic extension through December 31, 2014, in an amount not to exceed \$236,920.

This Contract is funded 100% by Mental Health Realignment. (No Rate Increase)

BACKGROUND:

This Contract meets the social needs of County's population in that it provides sub-acute skilled nursing care services for County's seriously and persistently mentally ill (SMPI) and neurobehavioral clients.

with Helios Healthcare, LLC., for the period from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013, which included a six-month automatic extension through December 31, 2013, for the provision of sub-acute skilled nursing care services.

Approval of Novation Contract #74-331-5 replaces the automatic extension under the prior Contract and allows the Contractor to continue providing services through June 30, 2014, including mutual indemnification to hold harmless both parties for any claims arising out of the performance of this Contract.

If this contract is not approved, there will be fewer sub-acute skilled nursing care services available for County's seriously mentally ill and neurobehavioral clients.
