Approve and authorize the Health Services Director, or his designee, to execute, on behalf of the County, Contract #74-458-1 with John Moranville, M.D., a self-employed individual, in an amount not to exceed \$274,400, to provide professional outpatient psychiatric services for mentally ill adults in Central County for the period from January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This Contract is funded 100% by Mental Health Realignment, offset by third-party billing. (No rate increase)

BACKGROUND:

For a number of years the County has contracted with Medical, Dental and Mental Health Specialists to provide specialized professional services, which are not otherwise available.
