FISCAL IMPACT:

Approval of this Agreement will allow the County to continue to receive funding from the State Department of Rehabilitation for fiscal years 2015/2016, 2016/2017, 2017/2018. No County match required.

BACKGROUND:

On March 27, 2012, the Board of Supervisors approved Standard Agreement #24-760-23 (as amended by Standard (Amendment) Agreement #24-760-24) with the State Department of Rehabilitation, to pay the County to provide vocational rehabilitation services for individuals with psychiatric disorders for the period from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2015.
