**RECOMMENDATION(S):**

Approve and authorize the Health Services Director, or his designee, to execute, on behalf of the County, Contract #27-839-2 with Mark N. Isaacs, M.D., Inc., a corporation, in an amount not to exceed \$120,000, to provide phlebology services for Contra Costa Health Plan (CCHP) members, for the period from May 1, 2015 through April 30, 2017.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

This Contract is funded 100% by Contra Costa Health Plan Enterprise Fund II. (No rate increase)

**BACKGROUND:**

On June 4, 2013, the Board of Supervisors approved Contract #27-839-1 with Mark N. Isaacs, M.D., Inc., a corporation, for the provision of phlebology services to CCHP members, for the period from May 1, 2013 through April 30, 2015. Approval of Contract #27-839-2 will allow Contractor to continue providing phlebology services through April 30, 2017.
