Starting at or before the 28th week of pregnancy, clients are visited at home, one-on-one with a trained nurse, visits continue throughout the pregnancy and the first two years of the child's life. The goal of the County's Public Health, Family and Maternal Child Health Program will be to empower first time mothers living in poverty to successfully change their lives and the loves of their children through evidence-based nurse home visiting, through June 30, 2019.
