Subject: Amendment #25-012-32 with The Center for Common Concerns, Inc. (dba HomeBase)

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Approve and authorize the Health Services Director, or his designee, to execute, on behalf of the County, Contract #25-012-32 with The Center for Common Concerns, Inc. (dba HomeBase), a non-profit corporation, effective March 1, 2015, to amend Contract #25-012-31, to increase the payment limit by \$211,025, from \$222,180 to a new payment limit of \$433,205, with no change in the original term of October 1, 2014 through September 30, 2015.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This Amendment is funded 24% by Federal Medi-Cal Administrative Activities (MAA), 30% Behavioral Health Administration, 12% by budgeted County General funds and 34% by Medi-Cal Administrative Activities/Housing and Urban Development. (No rate increase)
