FISCAL IMPACT:

This Contract is funded 50% Federal Financial Participation and 50% by Mental Health Realignment. (No rate increase)

BACKGROUND:

For a number of years the County has contracted with Mental Health Specialists to provide specialized medical services. On October 8, 2014, the County Administrator approved
