oversight board, which the State mandates be established with a membership composition described in statute.

Each oversight board is an independent decision-making body with a fiduciary responsibility to holders of enforceable obligations of each former city redevelopment agency as well as governmental taxing entities that remain within the former project areas of each dissolved agency. Each oversight board is supported by successor agency staff and must comply with the Ralph M. Brown Act, the California Public Records Act, and the Political Reform Act of 1974. The actions of each oversight board are overseen by the California Department of Finance and may be subject to disapproval or modification.

Resignations from Supervisr Gioia and Mr. Zell will not be formally accepted by the Board.
