APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Employment and Human Services Director, or designee, to execute a contract with Advocacy, Respect and Commitment Care Parent Network, in an amount not to exceed \$102,551 for the Family Empowerment Project for the period July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016.

FISCAL IMPACT:

\$102,551: 100% County (County local fines and fees, birth certificate funds).

BACKGROUND:

The proposed contract is the result of the the Family and Children's Trust Committee (FACT), Request for Proposals (RFP) #1143. FACT, an advisory group to the Board of Supervisors (BOS) was established by the BOS in 1982 to identify strategies and implement programs to improve services to prevent child abuse and neglect in Contra Costa County.

Advocacy, Respect and Commitment Care Parent Network will provide comprehensive services to families with children ages 6 to 22 years with special needs and/ or developmental disabilities with at risk for child abuse and/or neglect. Through the provision
