RECOMMENDATION(S):

ADOPT Position Adjustment Resolution No. 21699 to add one (1) Registered Nurse-Experienced Level (VWXD) position (\$7,305-\$8,142)in the Contra Costa Health Plan division of the Health Services Department.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The additional costs associated with this action are approximately \$156,770 annually with benefits, including \$34,688 in pension costs. Costs will be funded by CCHP Enterprise Fund II (100%).

BACKGROUND:

Contra Costa Health Plan's Case Management unit is in need of a full-time Registered Nurse position to handle the influx of patients needing Community-Based Adult Services (CBAS). In order for Contra Costa Health Plan to meet the mandated staffing requirements of the California Department of Health Services (DHCS), a full-time RN position is needed for this program. A new Adult Day Care facility is opening soon in Concord which will double the number of CBAS patients in CCHP.
