
This amendment is funded 100% by Hospital Enterprise Fund I. (No rate increase)

BACKGROUND:

In December, 2014, the County Administrator approved and the Purchasing Services Manager executed Contract #26-786 with Peter A. Castillo, M.D., for the provision of urogynecology clinics and surgical services at Contra Costa Regional Medical Center and Contra Costa Health Centers (CCRMC), for the period from December 1, 2014 through November 30, 2015. At the time of negotiations, the payment limit was based on target levels of utilization. However, the utilization during the term of the agreement was higher than originally anticipated. The County requested, and the Contractor agreed, to provide
