RECOMMENDATION(S):

Approve and authorize the Health Services Director, or his designee, to execute, on behalf of the County, Contract #74–143–23 with California Psychiatric Transitions Incorporated, a corporation, in an amount not to exceed \$1,022,000, to provide residential care and mental health services to severely emotionally disturbed adults for the period from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This Contract is funded 100% by Mental Health Realignment. (No rate increase)

BACKGROUND:

This Contract meets the social needs of County's population in that it provides a multi-disciplinary treatment program to adults who need active psychiatric treatment, including medication support and individual and group therapy services, as an alternative to hospitalization at a State Hospital.

On June 3, 2014, the Board of Supervisors approved Contract #74–143–22 with California Psychiatric Transitions Incorporated for the period from July 1, 2014 through June 30,
