BACKGROUND:

On July 12, 2005, the Board of Supervisors approved Unpaid Student Training Agreement #26-341-3 and on April 22, 2008 extended the term with Regents of the University of California, on behalf of University of California, San Francisco for the period from July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2015 to provide supervised fieldwork instruction experience with Health Services. Approval of Contract Extension Agreement # 26-341-5 will allow the Contractor's students to continue to receive supervised fieldwork instruction experience, at Contra Costa Regional Medical Center and Contra Costa Health Centers through June 30, 2020.
