BACKGROUND:

Contract #49076-00 with Steckbauer Weinhart, LLP was executed in April 2013 and the Treasurer-Tax Collector's office respectfully requests an increase of \$25,000 for Contract #49076-00 from November 1, 2015 through the end of the of contract term, April 30, 2016. The increase amount of the contract will ensure that sufficient resources are available to pay outstanding invoices and for County Counsel and the Treasurer-Tax Collector to refer additional bankruptcy cases to Steckbauer Weinhart, LLP as needed during the remainder of
