RECOMMENDATION(S):

Approve and authorize the Health Services Director, or his designee, to execute, on behalf of the County, Contract Amendment Agreement #24-403-15 with Jon Whalen, M.D., an individual, effective April 1, 2016, to amend Contract #24-403-14, to increase the payment limit by \$176,000, from \$300,800 to a new payment limit of \$476,800 with no change in the original term of February 1, 2016 through January 31, 2017.
