Subject: Approve Contract #26-664-3 with Paul S. Chard, M.D., Ph.D. for Gastroenterology Services

RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Health Services Director, or designee, to execute Contract #26-664-3 with Paul S. Chard, M.D., Ph.D., in an amount not to exceed \$132,000 to provide gastroenterology services at Contra Costa Regional Medical and Health Centers, for the period June 1, 2016 through May 31, 2018.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This Contract is funded 100% Hospital Enterprise Fund I. (Rate increase)

BACKGROUND:

On August 6, 2013, the Board of Supervisors approved Contract #26-664-2 with Paul S. Chard, M.D., Ph.D., to provide gastroenterology services including consultation, clinic coverage, training, on-call services, and medical and/or surgical procedures for patients at CCRMC for the period from June 1, 2013 through May 31, 2016. Approval of Contract #26-664-3 will allow the Contractor to continue to provide gastroenterology services through May 31, 2018.
