The fiscal impact will be \$10,000, 100% Keller Canyon Mitigation Funds. No General Fund match is required.


BACKGROUND:

This program benefits both community services and youth services by creating a mobile outreach and education program that reaches residents in their own neighborhoods.

Program objectives are to increase citizen awareness and local involvement in civic issues. The program plans to do this by bringing information into the community, as well as providing assistance with civic processes, such as voter registration and voting. This will impact these communities by increasing involvement in the issues that affect their daily lives. Bay Point, Pittsburg, and Antioch residents are underrepresented in Contra Costa,
