

BACKGROUND:

The CCRMC and the Contra Costa Health Centers do not have an adequate inventory of medication delivery equipment due to obsolescence. Equipment must be rented from a third party to meet the needs of the patient population. Carefusion Inc. provides medication equipment that will interface with the pharmacy's medication monitoring system. Purchasing the medication delivery equipment is more cost-efficient than renting the equipment. This purchase will enable the CCRMC and the Contra Costa Health Centers to greatly reduce or eliminate the need to rent the required equipment to supplement the
