APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Employment and Human Services Director, or designee to execute a contract with Contra Costa County Office of Education in an amount not to exceed \$690,000 for Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) In-School and Out-of-School Youth Services for the period July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. (100% Federal)

FISCAL IMPACT:

\$690,000 No County Costs; 100% Federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Youth Funding.

BACKGROUND:

This contract was awarded through Request for Proposal (RFP) #1134 for provision of services to eligible in-school youth and out-of-school youth ages 16 to 24 years old who are most in need, including Foster youth, Homeless youth, and other in-risk youth throughout Contra Costa County. Funding for this contact will come from Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) formula youth funds.
