Subject: Approve Novation Contract #74-399-6 with Contra Costa Interfaith Transitional Housing, Inc.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Health Services Director, or designee, to execute, on behalf of the County, Novation Contract #74-399-6 with Contra Costa Interfaith Transitional Housing, Inc., a non-profit corporation, in an amount not to exceed \$150,380 to provide community-based mental health services for Seriously Emotionally Disturbed (SED) youth for the period from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. This Contract includes a six-month automatic extension through December 31, 2017, in an amount not to exceed \$75,190.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This Contract is funded 50% Federal Financial Participation; 50% Mental Health Realignment. (3% Cost of Living Adjustment [COLA])

BACKGROUND:

On November 10, 2015, the Board of Supervisors approved Novation Contract #74-399-5 with Contra Costa Interfaith Transitional Housing, Inc., for the period from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016, which included a six-month automatic extension through December 31, 2016, for the provision of community-based mental health services.

BACKGROUND: (CONT'D)

Approval of Novation Contract #74-399-6, replaces the automatic extension under the prior Contract allowing the Contractor to continue providing services through June 30, 2017.

CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

If this contract is not approved, seriously emotionally disturbed youth will have reduced access to the mental health services provided by Contractor, including individual, group and family therapy; case management; and crisis intervention services.

CHILDREN'S IMPACT STATEMENT:
