RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Health Services Director, or his designee, to execute on behalf of the County, Novation Contract #24–705–61 with We Care Services for Children, a non-profit corporation, in an amount not to exceed \$1,779,635, to provide wrap-around and other mental health services including in-home behavioral therapy and intensive care coordination for high risk, delayed or emotionally disturbed children, for the period from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. This Contract includes a six-month automatic extension through December 31, 2017, in an amount not to exceed \$889,818.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This Contract is funded 50% Federal Financial Participation; 50% County Realignment. (Rate increase)

BACKGROUND: (CONT'D)

Approval of Novation Contract #24-705-61, replaces the automatic extension under the prior Contract allowing the Contractor to continue providing services through June 30, 2017.

CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

If this contract is not approved, seriously emotionally disturbed (SED) children within Contra Costa County will have reduced access to mental health services as the County solicits and engages an alternative Contractor.

CHILDREN'S IMPACT STATEMENT:

This program supports the following Board of Supervisors' community outcomes: "Children Ready For and Succeeding in School"; "Families that are Safe, Stable, and Nurturing"; and "Communities that are Safe and Provide a High Quality of Life for Children and Families".
