Subject: Approve Contract Amendment/Extension Agreement #23-299-14 with the City of El Cerrito

RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Health Services Director, or designee, to execute on behalf of the County, Contract Amendment/Extension Agreement #23-299-14 with the City of El Cerrito, for the provision of first responder paramedic services by its Fire Department, a public agency, effective June 30, 2016, to amend Contract #23-299-13, to increase the Contract Payment Limit by \$333,036 from \$111,012 to a new total payment limit of \$444,048 and to extend the termination date from June 30, 2016 to June 30, 2019.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This Amendment/Extension Agreement is funded 100% CSA EM 1 (Measure H) reflects an increase of \$333,036. (No rate increase).

BACKGROUND:

County Service Area EM-1 was established in 1989 to provide enhanced Emergency Medical Services, including rapid paramedic-staffed ambulance response, to the residents of Contra Costa County.

On June 16, 2015, the Board of Supervisors approved Contract #23-299-13, with the City of
