# **RECOMMENDATION(S):**

Approve and authorize the Health Services Director, or his designee, to execute, on behalf of the County, Interagency Agreement #29-602 with The Tides Center, a non-profit corporation, to pay County an amount not to exceed \$253,000, to provide mental health services and crisis intervention for the School Engagement Program, for the period from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017.

### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Approval of this Interagency Agreement will result in an amount not to exceed \$253,000 from The Tides Center. No County match required.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The Tides Center, Lincoln Child Center and the Health Services Department will collaborate to provide mental health services and crisis intervention to students enrolled in Contra Costa County schools and their families through the School Engagement Program. The County's Health Services Department will subcontract with Lincoln Child Center to provide mental health services and crisis intervention to students who have been referred to the School Engagement Program through the State of California Court Parent Truancy
