BACKGROUND: (CONT'D)

Under Interagency Agreement #28–885, County will provide school-based mobile clinic services to children within the Liberty Union High School District ("District"), through June 30, 2019, including County's agreement to indemnify the District.

CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

If this contract is not approved, low-income and disadvantaged school children in the Liberty Union High School District will not receive preventive health screenings, well-child examinations, and primary health care services from County's mobile clinics.
